This platform will open opportunities for u to address other health issues faced by the youth of this community i.e. high teenage pregnancy rates, with its associated high HIV infection rates among young girls.


We therefore request your support as the municipality in terms of capacity building/infrastructural/logistics for the youth and other community members to make this recycling project a success.






THE YOUTH OF UBOMBO COMMUNITY DURING THE CAMPAIGN.









## What is Radiography?

The study of radiography offers four specific degrees: Bachelor in Health Sciences (BHSc) in Diagnostic Radiography, Diagnostic Sonography, Nuclear Medicine and Radiotherapy.

Each of these programs are four year courses with the inclusion of both theory and practical training.

All qualified radiographers are required to complete a one year community service at a government healthcare facility.

Diagnostic Radiography:

A diagnostic radiographer produces radiographic images of parts of the body for further treatment and diagnosis.


Diagnostic Sonography:

Ultrasound uses high-frequency sound waves and a computer to create images of blood vessels, tissues and organs.

**Nuclear Medicine:** 

This is a medical specialty that uses small amounts of radioactive substances to show the function and anatomy of a body organ. This modality provides both diagnostic and therapeutic applications. Radiotherapy: This modality uses radiation as a treatment of disease together with x-rays or other ionizing radiation and by ingestion of radioisotopes.





## What are the requirements to study Radiography?

- -Minimum age of 18 years and older
- -Physically fit and strong: An applicant with severe disability and or blood-related illnesses may not be accepted for training. N.B: All students have compulsory medicals as part of the requirements as trainee radiation worker.


