## OFFICIAL OPENING OF CHILD SUPPORT GRANT SITE AT CHARLES JOHNSON MEMORIAL HOSPITAL.

On the 04th of March 2025 South African State Agency opened an official child support grant registration sites at Charles Johnson Memorial Hospital, this is following other sites that were officially opened in the province of Eastern Cape. This initiative aims to make it easier for parents to register their new-born's for the grant without having to travel to a separate SASSA office.

The service is available at several hospitals across the Eastern Cape and KwaZulu-Natal, with SAS-SA and Home Affairs representatives operating five days a week. In KwaZulu-Natal, SASSA has also launched on site Child Support Grant registration at the Prince Mshiyeni Hospital (Umlazi). This allows parents to register their newborns for the grant directly at the hospital, reducing the burden on families during a critical time. Parents can now register their new-borns for the Child Support Grant directly at the hospital before leaving the facility.

#### HEALTH SERVICES TO THE PEOPLE OF QHUDENI

On the 20<sup>th</sup> of November 2024 Charles Johnson Memorial Hospital under uMzinyathi health District took health services to the community of Qhudeni in Ward 01 at Vulindlela Traditional Council. This is a campaign initiated by the current MEC for Health, Ms Nomagugu Simelane-Mngadi which takes the form of community outreach services where health services are taken to the community.

Health workers are encouraged to do promotive and preventive healthcare activities outside the health facility premises. In this way, most health services that would be provided at a hospital are taken to a residential area for communities who may have difficulty to access them.

In an effort to provide free healthcare services to the people, Charles Johnson Memorial Hospital took health services to the community of Qhudeni. This is because this community have to travel a long distance of about 80km and pay a transport fee of R140 to get health care services at CJM Hospitals.

The programme attracted more than 480 community members of all age groups. This area was identified as one of the deep rural and most deprived area because of its physical and geographical environment.

Through this programme the hospital provided health promotion materials to the community and the community members were screened for different diseases. Doctors from the hospital were available to assist clients and medications was dispensed since the hospital pharmacy department was on the site to prescribed medication to the community. Patients with Chronic diseases like diabetes and blood pressure were also assisted.

HIV and TB tests were done and all of this was done, the elderly who needed walking sticks were provided with these items. This programme of delivering services directly to the community reduces burden of diseases in this community.

This area is also serviced by a mobile health clinics that come once a month. This is not for the first time that the hospital visited the area as it was done before in 2023, the management have seen that there is a great need for the hospital to re-visit Qhudeni area.

#### **ISIBAYA SAMADODA CAMPAIGN**

On 28 November 2024 Charles Johnson Memorial Hospital hosted Isibaya Samadoda at Mbokod-webomvu Tribal Council. Prince Nhlanganiso Zulu urged men to intensify the fight against HIV by getting circumcised.

At an *Isibaya Samadoda* men's health event held at Slutshane area under Nquthu Local Municipality, Prince N Zulu highlighted the crucial role of circumcision in reducing HIV transmission and promoting overall health. His father, the late King Goodwill Zwelithini kaBhekuZulu, was at the forefront of the fight against HIV and AIDS in KwaZulu -Natal. He was committed to enhancing men's health and cited medical circumcision as a proactive measure to prevent HIV. He often used cultural events to raise awareness of HIV/AIDS.

Isibaya Samadoda is a men's health movement that also encourages men to focus on their physical and emotional wellness and cultural identity. Isibaya Samadoda loosely translates to 'the circle of men' in isiZulu.
