OFFICIAL OPENING OF INKOSI THATHEZAKHE CLINIC.

The rural community of Maduladula and surrounding areas at Nquthu, North of KwaZulu-Natal is set to benefit it tremendously on health care services when Provincial MEC for health hands over the world-class Inkosi Thathezakhe Clinic, under Inkosi Ngobese on 16 August 2018. The event was held at Khiphinkunzi Tribal Court.

The clinic will bring much needed relief to 10 615 strong rural community of Maduladula and surrounding community in Ward 08. Previously the residents in some areas had to wait for a Mobile clinic to visit in once a month, in order for them to access health care services. The mobile clinic will be coming from the mother hospital (Charles Johnson Memorial Hospital). The only option for the local residents was to take public transport which is 10km to mother hospital CJM Hospital to access health care services.

But with the opening of Inkosi Thathezakhe clinic file will be never be the same as health care services have now been brought to their own doorstep.

The event attracted more than 2000 community members from Nquthu. The event was held at Inkosi Thathezakhe Tribal Authority Inkosi were excited about the official opening on the clinic as he said that people who were sick they used to dye at homes because they were not able to reach CJM Hospital because of transport and financial problem and the hospital is 10km away from Nquthu town. The MEC appealed to the community members that they must get used to test for different illnesses in their clinics so that they can know their status.

He also appeal to both community and staff members to work together so that there will be no misunderstanding.
