Other parents have passed away either by storm accidents or by the HIV pandemic. To keep the youth healthy and fit at all times the department of health encourages the youth to be involved in sports. Local youth were offered soccer kits. This initiative is aimed at keeping the youth healthy and strong. It is also aimed at keeping the youth from drugs.

The audience was entertained with music from South African famous artists. Exchanging the podium were Phuzekhemisi, Izingane Zoma etc.

The local community did not believe as they witnessed all this with their naked eyes. In closing the KZN Health MEC told women that there is Anti-Natal Care at the clinic so there is no need to go to CJM Hospital for that service. She told the community to utilize that service.

service components. The community were coming in their huge numbers to access the services. There were long queues of the local community that wanted to access the various services. The above is the depiction of what was actually happening at the various service points. On the above we see the Department of health offering services to the community. Nurses were checking vital signs etc.

The Optometrist was also attending to the long queue that wanted the eye services. Elderly people were the most that were queuing to check their eyes to the Optometrist. Other people were using this initiative to

consult the doctor. It should be remembered that many of these communities are very poor and do not have enough money to go to the near by hospital to access the health related services. Accessing the services of the doctor is the chance they can not afford to loose. Likewise services like Social Development, SASSA, Department of Welfare, etc are far apart from this local community.

As promised on April 20, 2009 the Honorable MEC for Social Development Dr. B. M. Radebe handed over the Site for building a One Stop Development Centre which amount to 20 million rand to Inkosi P. P. Molefe and Inkosi Hlatshwayo.
