On the 23rd of August 2017 Mhlangana Clinic hosted an open day where an estimated of +/- 300 community members came to attend the event. The event was well attended by the community. Amongst the invitees were key figures Inkosi N.E. Mchunu, Dr. F.J. Sikhakhane, Umzinyathi District Municipality Honorable Speaker, Mr. M. Sithole, Municipal Ward Councillor, Induna Malembe and Induna M.E. Ximba who is the Clinic Committee Chairperson were present.

The programme of the day was on a high note from start to finish. The event was diverse since we had different speeches from different disciplines. Induna Malembe welcomed all present and the Q.A. Zungu, Operational Manager of the clinic stated the purpose of the day.

A presentation by Mrs. L. Mahlobo from Umzinyathi District Oral Health stressed the importance of keeping your mouth clean. Oral hygiene services were rendered. Miss. M. Mvelase Mhlangana, Clinic Support Service Officer educated the community about the booking system. Mr. J.M. Mazibuko from EMS: Umzinyathi District clarified on how the ambulances operate.

Mr. Sbu Ngcobo from Medi post & Mr. Brian Masimula from Medi Logistics educated the community of Mhlangana about CCMDD programme. It would have not been an event if there was no entertainment from Mhlangana Community Care Givers (CCG's) who gave us an educational songs and Amatsheyitshe local group gave us Indlamu.

An open day basically is an event whereby an institution gives brief information on how it operates and to also give an insight on the services which are available in that particular institution. Regarding operational hours of the clinic, Mhlangana Clinic ensures that is opens on time and closes with the last person who is inside the clinic leaves, even if it's past closing time.

Services that are rendered at Mhlangana Clinic are: Minor ailments, Family Planning, Chronic Disease Management, Immunisation, Counselling, TB Management, HIV/AIDS Management, Mental Health, Ante Natal Care, Post Natal Care, Rehabilitation, Pap Smears, Health Education, Dental Care, Maternity Services, STI Management, Nutrition, Emergency Services, Communicable Diseases, Medical Male Circumcision, Eye Health & CCMDD

TEENAGE PREGNACY AWARENESS

Teenage pregnancy is defined as a teenage or underage girl (usually within the ages of 13–19) becoming pregnant. Pregnancy has very important consequences for teen girls and teen boys, and their children. Having a baby as a teen makes it much harder for a boy or girl to reach their goals, such as finishing high school, going on to college, getting a good job, or getting married when they grow up, and poses additional challenges to the child as well. Some teen mothers decide to continue their pregnancy and then choose adoption for their baby. Others plan on keeping the baby.

On the 2nd of August 2017 Church of Scotland Hospital Outreach Teams visited Mhlakothi High School to raise awareness on the grossly increasing rate of teenagers who are falling pregnant while they are still doing their higher education as well as the dropping of the pass rate.

- No of teenagers (girls) attended 83 Target: 14 -18years, target no 120 girls.
- Targeted those schools which had high rate of teenage pregnancy from 2014 to date.
- ◆ Target number 5 leaners per high school = 120 girls

Proposed venue

- ◆ Msinga High School but due to financial constrains ended up done at COSH had to pay R50 per leaners at Msinga High − R 50 x 120= R6000
- Accommodation: COSH campus dormatries

Catering:

- No funding for Zazi. Managers , PHC supervisors and CDC staff from COSH donated R 1300
- LAC members donated R 112.00
- Municipality Rice, Beef, Chicken, Juice, Water, Fruits and donated the sum of R300
