News from the crisis centre

Ms Nyandeni is currently the only person working in the crisis centre.

In this past year the new facilities, allocated for the crisis centre, have been furnished. The equipment and furniture improved service delivery, although the centre still lacks a few necessities for example health educational videos and cassettes for the clients to listen to.

Ms Nyandeni attended a three-day course in May 2004 conducted by the Independent Medics Legal Unit (IMLU) on forensic medicine, law and ethics as well as counselling on crimes against women and children.

Ms Nyandeni encourages all personnel to get acquainted with this new service, which is now available in the institution.

She mentioned that at crisis centre she is dealing with abused women and children as well as cases of rape and assault.

Ms Nyandeni feels that if all employees know what service is being delivered at the crisis centre the hospital and community will have a better understanding of abuse and violence. Due to ignorance most of the abused in the community are neglected.

Ms Nyandeni also encourage employees to donate all their old clothes to crisis centre for clients to wear since their own clothes needs to be taken from them in order to send it to Pretoria for forensic analysis.

As editorial committee we wish Ms Nyandeni all the best with this great task in the future.
