EKOMBE CLINICS NEWS

The health needs of all the people within the Ekombe catchment area are addressed through PHC approach as it is the first contact care with the patient before he or she goes to the hospital. There are six fixed clinics that operate eight hours a day with the on call system. There is Gateway clinic and Mobile clinics that are serving 28 points. All these clinics provide the following services.

Voluntary Counselling and Testing— will be provided to you when you want to know your HIV status. Health promotion activities— these involve mainly the health talks to help you live a healthy lifestyle. Antenatal care services— monitoring of growth and wellbeing of the baby during pregnancy.

Delivery services— for safe delivery of the baby. Child Health Care Services— monitoring of growth and development of the child from birth to five years of age. Prevention of Mother to Child Transmission (Dual Therapy) Programme— preventing the child from contracting the HIV virus from the mother during delivery.

Family Planning services—for spacing of children and control of birth. Counselling for Choice of Termination of Pregnancy, Sexually Transmitted Infection screening, Cervical cancer screening, TB Screening—for early detection and early treatment starting, Minor ailments, Treatment for chronic diseases and Referral system is in place.

Other support services available in the clinic include:

Outreach programme— where a team of multidisciplinary members visit the clinic. You must please find out from the clinic staff of the date of their visit.

Community Health Workers are also available although there is still a gross shortage

When visiting our clinics, you will be treated with respect and dignity. Confidentiality is maintained at all times.




