

There are alot of the staff members I didn't call out by name not because the did nothing but because I could not recall everyone.


Thank you so much, ningapheli amandla ngisho nisebenza ngaphansi kwezimo ezinzima kodwa you have stayed true to the Oath you took.

## REVAMPED PHILANDODA SITE

hilandoda site is our high transmission service point strategical located in the high volume area focusing specifically to male clients.

This service point has been located at Eshowe Main Taxi Rank ever since 2017 focusing to male wellness; HIV testing TB &STI screening; ART initiations and MMC Recruitments.

location of the this service point was becoming problematic in terms of Infection Prevention Control. The situated in a water drainage route which made it to be muddy beyond any cleaning attempts. Public were urinating to the wall leaving facility with a very bad smell.

Working in partnership with MSF the site was relocated the most strategic point within the Taxi Rank and is now well fenced and well controlled in terms of access. The hygiene in the clinic is now proving that one is in a health facility.

## PHC OHSC AUDIT



establishments.

The following facilities were audited in November 2022, Ndlangubo; Nkwalini; Siphilile and Ekuphumuleni Clinic.

Preliminary report issued shows that they were few items that were not found but facilities insisted that they do exist.

Facilities have then been given a period to furnish OHSC with those evidence before final report and relevant certificate being issued.

ffice of Health and Standard Compliance visited PHC Facilities to measure their compliance with the Health Standards.

This Office is entrusted with critical task to be a community watch dog to determine if the Health facilities should or should not be trusted by the community as Health Providers. They have to issue compliance certificate (Authority to continue operating) or none compliance certificate (closure) of facility. They do this task by auditing the facilities against the Health standards that are set for Health

The evidence required have been successfully uploaded for OHSC to evaluated and release final report.

Should the facilities found none compliant; they will be monitored closely by OHSC on regular bases to ensure they comply with set standards failing after that will lead to certificate of non Compliant being issued.
