Parents wait until it's too late and as a results these children grow up with anger and at times default treatment or even worse try to commit suicide. Those were the remarks by Dr. Zulu during World Aids Day event which was held at Loskop area kwaGeza Hall on the 01 December 2020. The event started with the march led by the principals from the main road to the venue and demonstrators chanting slogans against gender based violence (GBV). MEC Nomusa Dube-Ncube urged the attendees to play their role in the fight against gender based violence and expressed concern over surge in a number of GBV cases in KZN. MEC Dube then led the candle lighting ceremony in remembrance of all those that are living with the virus and those that have lost the battle against HIV/AIDS. In her closing remarks, she pleaded with the community not to discriminate but to support those living with the virus in the fight against HIV/AIDS.

#### **LAUNCH OF DAPLAP MEDS**

It was noted with concern by the department of health that most of the clinics are always full and had to come up with a turnaround strategy hence the CCMDD programme was introduced mainly to alleviate pressure on PHC facilities. The programme has been successful nevertheless few challenges with the programme presented an opportunity for the introduction of a better programme called Dablap meds.

Dablapmeds programme was launched on the 20 November 2020 at Connor Street clinic. It seeks to strengthen adherence clubs, make use pick up points, put Cipla containers, strengthening relations with local pharmacy and have also included bicycles in an effort of further decanting PHC facilities. Requirements remains the same but patients will now have an option to choose any pick up points of their choice within the province so far and hopefully nationally in the near future. The launch was attended by all the OM's of the PHC facilities, pharmacy staff and other stakeholders. Ms. Zinhle Tlou urged them to market dablapmeds programme for us to collectively relieve pressure from our facilities.
