COVID-19 HAS A NEGATIVE IMPACT ON MENTAL HEALTH

October is mental health awareness month and Estcourt Hospital has targeted different outpatients departments including PHC facilities to educate people about the importance of mental health. All builds-up activities to Mental Health Awareness day were done in October and the event was on the 7 November 2021. The objective was to acknowledge that Covid-19 and other socio-economic factors have a negative impact on mental health of some of the people and to encourage them to seek help as soon as possible.

The Mental Health Awareness Day was kick started with health education on mental health at OPD/ Casualty. Psychologists explained different signs that people should look out for when one has mental health problem. Those that are suffering from mental health were urged to

acknowledge that they need assistance as a first step to the healing process.

Also available on the day were relatives of mental healthcare users accompanying them to the psych clinic and were welcomed by the hospital management Relatives were urged to ensure that they report when mentally ill patients are complaining of side effects and also report when there is a sudden change in behavior so that necessary interventions can be made.

The importance of adherence to treatment was also emphasized so that patients' condition can be controlled. At the end patients were taught basic physical exercise that they can do at home for them to be healthy. Relatives were urged to take care of mental healthcare users and support them as we continue to fight against Covid-19.
