Dietetics presented a new, standardized referral form for all departments.







On the 21st of April 2015, GJC Staff members from Casualty, Physio and Gateway clinic set out on an Outreach campaign responding to MEC for health Dr. S Dhlomo for the child health week to provide information and easy access to healthcare for the little ones in the areas surrounding our hospital. The week was set aside as per MEC's message who called on all parents and guardians of children in the Province to take advantage of Child Health Week, which began on Monday (20 April 2015) and runs until

During Child Health Week, mothers and care givers were urged to bring their children to Clinics, Mobile Clinics, Phila Mntwana Centres, and other temporary points for screening and health services for children. Ugu Health District and GJ Crookes Hospital then created temporary service points which were active throughout this period where necessary healthcare was provided and tests for HIV and TB were done.

KwaZulu-Natal MEC for Health Dr Sibongiseni Dhlomo has expressed concern at the high mortality rates due to the main causes of child deaths such as Diarrhoea, Pneumonia, Malnutrition, TB and HIV-related infections. The MEC says the department is determined to accelerate Child Health Services drastically in order to save more lives of children aged 5 and younger, before the evaluation of the Millennium Development Goals at the end of 2015. The campaign then started at the Amandawe Community Hall and ended at the Amandawe community Care Centre. Where most parents and CCG's came out in numbers with their children to receive health care services
