Therefore if you have diabetes or high blood pressure, please treat them first and then make a booking to eye clinic. Stanger hospital eye care service is trying to give earliest appointment when necessary. Our Cataract surgery waiting period is one day to one week depending upon patient's diabetic and hypertensive condition.

- Proper control over dispensing of ophthalmic medications and reduced unnecessary medication.
- Management of all kind of eye trauma and if necessary telephonic consultation at St.Aidans hospital.
- Regular cataract and glaucoma surgery. Now Stanger eye care center perform 10 to 12 cataract with intraocular lens implant and glaucoma surgery per week.
- Total approximate 240 ophthalmic microsurgery performed from mid July 2004 to February 2005 and 392 Cataract surgery with IOL implant done from March 2005 to March 2006. Also performed 5 cataract surgery camps over week end.
- Setting up diabetic and hypertensive retinopathy clinic and total 249 patients were benefited by receiving laser treatment at St.Aidans Hospital since March

2004.

- Total 4 Cataract surgeons were trained from 2004 till today.
- Total 15 PHC nurses were given primary Eye Care service training as well as cataract case finder.


