

WASTE MANAGEMENT IMPROVED

In February 2023, the contracted Company for removal of Health Care Risk Waste, Compass Waste Medical Services introduced the 90lt reusable eco-friendly waste containers for disposal of infectious waste in the general in-patient wards namely, Medical, Surgical and Maternity wards. Through this eco-friendly container, Grey's hospital has a reduced number of waste units been used per monthly, from +-2650 units to +-1800 units.

Some of the most significant benefits of this reusable container is the reduction of waste units been collected; it is also designed to have little damaging effects on the environment, it is reusable and therefore reduces cost incurred. It reduces the amount of waste that will need to be recycled or sent to landfills and incinerators. According to the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), about 30% of landfill waste is made up of packaging materials so by using reusable containers; we can significantly reduce the amount of waste we produce, as it reduces the need for new landfills and incinerators as we are not constantly disposing of reusable containers.

Reusable packaging eliminates the need to recycle or remanufacture single use packaging, reducing CO2 (greenhouse gas) emissions by up to 60%. Lastly, using reusable containers can have community benefits which is to prevent the unnecessary exploitation of our natural world. Every time we use a single-use item and put in the garbage, we also throw away all the natural resources – the trees, the oil, the water and the energy it took to make and get that product into our hands.

Epilepsy, a disorder in which nerve cell activity in the brain is disturbed, causing seizures. There are many causes of epilepsy, including an imbalance of nerve-signalling chemicals called neurotransmitters, tumors, strokes, and brain damage from illness or injury, or some combination of these.

Symptoms of Epilepsy include: staring, temporary confusion, uncontrolled jerking movements of the arms and legs, stiffening of the body, loss of consciousness or awareness, breathing problems, loss of bladder or bowel control.

What can you do to help someone who is having a seizure:

- Assist the person to the floor
- Turn the person onto their side
- Call for help
- Put a pillow, or something soft under their head
- Do not put anything in the person's mouth or between their teeth

Mrs Cynthia Mnikathi from Epilepsy SA and Nonhlanhla Ntuli provided talks on Coping skills which included the importance of taking your medication, eating a healthy diet, avoid alcohol and recreational drugs and try and reduce stress and anxiety.

INITIATION OF THE COVID-19 VACCINE 5-11 YEAR OLD PROGRAMME

Grey's hospital is currently in phase 1 of the Covid -19 vaccination of the 5-11 year's old programme roll-out which is co-ordinated by Sr S Marillier. The programme commenced on the 24 May 2023. The programme group consists of three vaccinators, one administrative clerk, one vaccine coordinator and two facility champions. The target population is the 5- 11year old children who are at risk of developing severe disease. The children are offered the Covid -19 vaccination consisting of two doses of monovalent Comirnaty paediatric vaccine which is administered with an minimum interval of 21 days between the two doses.

They have vaccinated a total of 327 children by end of August 2023. The programme staff have been trained on EVDS and on demand creation. The referral and appointment system is used to identify clients that are seen for chronic ailments. Technical Working Group (facility level) meetings are held to discuss implementation and roll-out of the programme, weekly district meetings and two weekly National meetings are held to monitor progress and implementation. Grey's hospital is has been flagged by National and Provincial as a bench marking site. On the 19 July 2023 some of the eThekweni district hospitals visited Grey's hospital to benchmark the system we used to implement and roll-out the programme. The programme group consists of Sr Sharon Marillier (vaccine coordinator/Facility Champion 1 and Provisional Champion) Dr Mary Morgan (HOD paediatrics /Facility Champion 2), Sr Daphine Mpinga (vaccinator), Sr Ntombenhle Nene(vaccinator), Sr Zama Shabalala (Vaccinator) and Shivar Innerjeeth (Administrative clerk).

BURNS AWARENESS WEEK

A burn's victim may seem like they have been affected only physically, but, the truth is that burn's leaves physical as well as emotional and mental impacts in a person's life. Anyone can be unfortunate and experience some form of burn injury in their lives and according to the Red Cross War Memorial Children's Hospital, burn injuries are usually accidental and are a common cause of unintentional injury. The Social Work Department and the Psychology Department at Grey's Hospital commemorates Burns Awareness Week with the purpose of creating awareness of the psychosocial issues related to burn injury and to encourage preventative measures to prevent burn injuries in homes. As the winter months approach, the use of candles, paraffin stoves and open fires increase the risk of burn injuries, with children being the highest risk. As a society, we have a responsibility to take care of our children and prevent burn injuries. We need to be aware of potential risks in our home for burns. We have a responsibility to teach our children about safe ways of preventing burn injuries and correct ways to deal (treatment including first aid) with injuries once a burn accident has taken place.

First Aid measures you can take for burn victims:

- Cool the burn
- Remove jewelry, belts and other tight items
- Cover the burn-loosely with gauze or a clean cloth
- Raise the burned area-lift the wound area
- Do not burst blisters

Cervical cancer is the second most common cancer worldwide in women under the age of 45 years and the third leading cause of cancer deaths amongst women worldwide after breast and lung cancer.

Every woman is at risk whatever her age or family history. However, it is a cancer that can be detected early and can be prevented.

FOOD FOR THOUGHT :

- ⇒ Cervical cancer is the second most common cancer in women under 45 years of age after breast cancer
- ⇒ A common virus, HPV is the main cause of cervical cancer
- ⇒ You may be at risk whatever your age
- ⇒ The virus is transmitted through sexual intercourse and intimate skin-to-skin contact in the genital area.
- ⇒ Condoms do not offer full protection
- ⇒ Infection rarely shows symptoms, whilst most infection clears up naturally, some remain and develop into cervical cancer
- ⇒ The new HPV vaccine rollout in schools and pharmacies will assist us in preventing this cancer.


