STROKE AWARENESS DAY

On 24/05/2019 Imbalenhle CHC held the stroke awareness campaign for our patients and the public. The campaign was conducted by the Occupational Therapy, Physiotherapy and Speech therapy department. Our target areas were our main waiting areas within the facility.

- Creating awareness regarding signs and symptoms of a stroke, as well as the appropriate action to take
- Explaining the common after-effects experienced after stroke
- Educating the public on specific services that can assist patients post –stroke (Occupational therapist, Speech therapist, and Physio therapist)

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BREASTFEEDING AWARENESS

Imbalenhle CHC had a 5 day long awareness campaign on breastfeeding. The 5 day campaign was based on the following Health education on exclusive breasting, Health education on complementary feeding and continued breastfeeding, Health education on breastfeeding in the context of HIV, Health education on infant and young child feeding (summary of the past three days) and the breastfeeding event on the last day.

On the 7th of August 2019 the Breastfeeding event was held. The theme of the event was to "Empower Parents, Enable Breastfeeding". The Invitation was forwarded all our patients most important women who had babies that are still breastfeeding and those who are our antenatal patients who are still expecting. The event was organised by our dietitian, nutritional advisors from our referral clinics, antenatal clinic and other stake holders from the CHC.

- Some patients were very receptive.
- Some patients already knew quite a lot about breastfeeding, meaning health education is an on-going process.
- Some patients were grateful to have learned something new.
- Patients were happy they did not go hungry.
- The number of people who attended was not disappointing.


