SPEECH - LANGUAGE THERAPY

he ability to communicate effectively is essential to achieve and maintain quality of life. Speech/Language and associated cognitive/intellectual disorders can adversely affect academic performance, workforce integration, and social interaction.

Treatments provided by the Speech-Language Therapist can help individuals with expressive and receptive language, articulation, fluency, voice, resonance and cognitive communication disorders (e.g. memory, organization, problem solving, reach their full communicative potential.





Speech—language Therapist has been trained to assess and treat people who have a communication disability or swallowing disorders.

Our Speech Therapist responsibilities at Imbalenhle CHC are:

- Giving advice on feeding to a mother who has a baby with a deft palate (swallowing/feeding problems).
- Work with children who are hard to understand due to speech difficulties (delayed speech/language).
- Work with children who have difficulties at school (learning disabilities).
- Work with people who stutter (stuttering).
- Train people who constantly lose their voices to use it more effectively (voice disorders).
- Helping stroke patients regain their communication skills, advising family on dealing/managing the patient.
- Rehabilitating people with severe brain injury.
- Liaising with families who have members with dementia.
- Providing communication strategies for persons with intellectual disabilities.
- Treating a patient who has swallowing problems following a stroke.
- Assisting children/adults who are learning to read.

Iso of concern individuals with untreated swallowing disorders can find themselves at risk of dehydration, malnutrition and pulmonary compromise. Speech Language Therapists are trained to provide therapies that lead to improved swallowing safety, function, and independence.

As a result referral to Speech Language Therapy services ensures early identification and management of both communication and swallowing disorders which in turn enables maximum social, academic and vocational integration.

ccupational Therapy deals with rehabilitating individuals with physical or psychiatric disabilities in order for them to resume their previous level of function prior to the disability or to reach their optimum level function to the disability.

Occupational Therapy is often confused with Physiotherapy, however as OT's we are working very hard to get other health professionals and communities at large to acknowledge and understand what Occupational Therapy entails.

Our aim is to :-

- Make the community of Imbali and other areas within Imbalenhle CHC catchment area aware of Occupational Therapy services that are available at the clinic.
- To provide optimum high quality services to the community with our resources and make proper referrals if need be.

he availability of this service at Imbalenhle CHC will help to make the community aware that the disabilities, be it congenital or residual, of which they thought could not be rehabilitated or minimized can actually be addressed.

These disabilities could be as a result of any of the following conditions:-

- ♦ Stroke
- ♦ Traumatic brain
- ♦ Gunshot/stab wound
- ♦ MVA/PVA
- ♦ Cerebral palsy
- Down syndrome
- Developmental delay

Therefore the community is encouraged to bring any individuals with a condition which is affecting the per-

son's ability to function on a day to day basis causing that person to be dependent on family members or those closer to them.
