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

A total head count of 376 patients were attended on the day 113 males and 263 females.

We also did door to door visits while handing out IEC material Two work stations were prepared and to offer services within the Area.

A total number of 101 clients were tested for TB on the day. All clients were tested for TB using the Gen expert.

On 23 February 2024, Imbalenhle CHC held a teenage pregnancy awareness campaign. The primary purpose of this campaign was to engage learners from our local high schools as we had identified that there was a challenge with teenage pregnancy in the area.

We then invited eight leaners from each High school within our catchment area to be part of this campaign. During this campaign there were presentations from our staff members on the effects of teenage pregnancy, family planning and GBV/Behavior change which was presented by our partner (TBHIV Care) led by Ms. B Mkhize.

Apart from presentations there was a dialogue which engaged the learners on through questions on issues related to teenage pregnancy. There was also a reading and signing of the pledge by the learners.

The leaners as chosen to represent their schools was advised to escalate the information amongst their peers at school as well as their friends.
