Challenges hindering family involvement in the hospital nursing care of a child with autism

Sokhera, D.G. & Ngwongo, T.S.P., 2025, 'Challenges hindering family involvement in the hospital nursing care of a child with Background: Family involvement is crucial in a child's treatment; however, many professional nurses still neglect to involve families in their child's care. Studies have indicated that the perceived lack of family involvement in hospitalised children with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) is a problem in many countries. Few studies have been conducted in Africa with none relating to family involvement; highlighting the need for further research.

Aim: To develop in-depth insights into the challenges regarding family involvement in hospital nursing care of children with ASD, in the South African context.

Setting: Paediatric wards at selected private hospitals and family homes in the eThekwini District of KwaZulu-Natal.

Methods: An interpretative phenomenological analysis method was used. A sample of 10 professional nurses and 10 family members was achieved by purposive sampling. Data were collected from participants using semi-structured in-depth interviews.

Results: The following challenges were identified by the participants: the lack of knowledge of nurses regarding ASD, nurses not listening to family, uncaring attitude of nurses, nurses' lack of time and shortage of nursing staff.

Conclusion: Nurses play a pivotal role in overcoming the challenges to family involvement, in the hospital mursing care, of a child with ASD. Making nurses aware of the challenges will help improve family involvement in hospitals nursing for the child with ASD.

Contribution: This study added to the body of knowledge by identifying the challenges to the involvement of families in the hospital nursing care of a child with ASD.

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PROGRAMME ACCREDITATION UPDATE



South African Nursing Council Regulating nursing, advocating for the public



COUNCIL ON HIGHER EDUCATION



The KwaZulu-Natal College of Nursing have developed curriculum for eleven postgraduate diplomas', to be implemented at eight of its campuses. Nine of these PGDip programmes, have been approved (fully/partially) by the South African Nursing Council (SANC) and they have also been conditionally accredited by the Council on Higher Education (CHE).

At the Victoria Mxenge Campus, the following programmes have received full approval from SANC and full accreditation CHE: Postgraduate Diploma in Adult Critical Care Nursing, Postgraduate Diploma in Orthopaedic Nursing, Postgraduate Diploma in Perioperative Nursing. All these Postgraduate Diploma are now awaiting registration with SAQA (SAQA IDs) which are required prior to implementation of the programmes.

The Postgraduate Diploma in Emergency Nursing and the Postgraduate Diploma in Midwifery have received full approval from SANC but conditional accreditation with CHE. Once all the condition of accreditation for CHE have been met and CHE has given these programmes full Accreditation then only will they proceed to SAQA for a SAQA ID.

The Postgraduate Diploma in Child Nursing has received SANC approval and are awaiting CHE accreditation. All postgraduate diplomas will be offered at NQF level 8.


Farewell Group 1-2024

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SANC QUALITY CONTROL INSPECTION VISIT TO VICTORIA MXENGE HOSPITAL FOR R171 (RK KHAN CAMPUS) STUDENTS

Officials from the South African Nursing Council accreditation and quality control departments visited Victoria Mxenge Hospital on 12th February 2025. The purpose of the visit was a Quality Control Inspection of the facility for the R171 programme (Diploma in Nursing). Although Victoria Mxenge Campus does not offer the R171 programme, staff from VMC supported R K Khan Campus with accreditation readiness. On the Day of the visit, the Nursing Manager of VMH: Mrs F. Ngcobo delivered a presentation on the hospital departments, nursing staff complement, quality assurance and support services available. The presentation was attended by Victoria Mxenge Hospital CEO and departmental nursing managers; Victoria Mxenge Campus staff as well as RK Khan Campus Staff. After the presentation, breakaway teams were formed by the SANC officials and selected hospital units were visited for a walk about and to view evidence.

Towards the end of the visit, the teams re-joined and feedback was given to all departments within VMH as a collective. Overall, the visit went well and the concluding message was that the SANC was satisfied with the services offered at VMH as well as the nursing care provided to patients.
