he department of Social Work hosted an awareness campaign for no violence against women and children on 6 December 2016. It was held in the Eye Clinic and attended by patients and all staff from various departments.

An invited guest for the morning was Ms P Blose from Kerr House, a shelter for abused women and children. She shared her knowledge and experience about the different forms of violence like domestic violence circle and symptoms of abuse.


A stage play was performed by a group of staff members including our in-service students which displayed all kinds of violence which happens in our homes without many of us being aware. It was an eye opening to everyone as sometimes we overlooked at things happening in our families and to the neighborhood.

The second speaker was from Mayville Police Station, Warrant Officer Zikalala who addressed the audience encouraging everyone to report any form of abuse as soon as it is suspected.

He also warned parents not to abuse their children by using them in custody battles. Their department often realizes that parents have asked their children to lie on their behalf and he cautioned the audience that this wastes their departments expertise and efforts where their time should be used on real cases of abuse and domestic violence. A contact number was given where you can leave a message if you want to remain anonymous.

There was a question an answer session on the psychological effects of abuse. Dr S John (our psychologist). Invited those whom would like to see her on one on one session. It was quite a moving experience for everyone.

Males were also encourage to circumcise to reduce the percentage of contracting HIV and other illnesses. Parents were also encouraged to teach their children about safe sex and also to educate young girls on the issue of "blessers" where young girls are being used for sex and are often getting infected with HIV and this is causing the spread of HIV to other families in the community as these men go back to their wives. It is a vicious and sad cycle that needs u to be stopped was her plea.
