HAST dept. hosted a Pediatric disclosure programme event on the 4th of July 2015, through a needs analysis they have identified a high rate of poor adherence in children. The biggest reason identified was that disclosure of the HIV status was not done to children by parents or care givers.

The unit decided to form a support group which meets once a month. Different issues were discussed and disclosure as one of the topic, which parents raised as a challenge. HIV is "too sensitive and confidential to be shared anyhow". As a department they have decided to start a program called Journey to disclosure using "HAND OF SAFETY".

Different stakeholders were invited to assist us on this journey; however the follow up care will be done by Turton multidisciplinary team, to tackle psycho social issues

Their target groups are 3 – 5 years, 6 – 9, 10 -12 years and 13 -15 years. Also 16 and 17 years old will be included as need arises.








