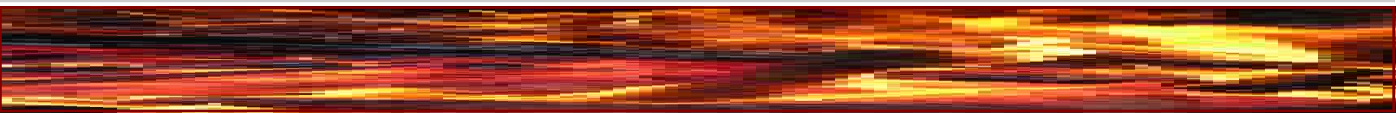

- Carbon Dioxide, it is labeled in black

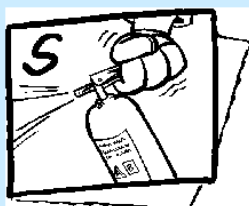

When to Use a Fire Extinguisher

- First, activate fire alarm to evacuate the building, and to notify the fire department.
- Select the proper extinguisher.
- Use only if you know how, and are confident about using the extinguisher.
- Use only if the fire is small and contained.
- Stay low to avoid breathing smoke.
- Always keep a clear exit available.
