
Our goal is to be the best district hospital of choice by continuing to reinforce and build a culture of excellence within our hospital and clinics.
























DISABILITY AWARENESS 2024.



HEALTH ALERTS.

PREVENT HEAT RELATED ILLNESSES THIS SUMMER!

Be cautious and Observant! Keep an eye out for signs of heat illness.

If you think, you, your child, partner, family member, colleague or community member is suffering from heat illness, get medical help as soon as possible.

Always check and give care to children, pregnant women, the elderly, the disabled and persons with comorbidities, the are most vulnerable to heat.

Seek emergency medical attention at your nearest health facility or call an ambulance immediately on worse case scenarios.

Look out for regular weather updates from all media platforms.

Avoid heavy physical work or activities during peak hours of extreme hot days.

Cool yourself under the shade, when walking outside wear a hat or cap or use an umbrella to cover yourself from Sun rays.

Protect your eyes and wear shade glasses, apply sunscreen to exposed area of the skin.

Wear minimal to bright light clothing that reflect the sun.

Store your food, medicines at recommended temperature away from direct sunlight.

Prior to loadshedding or water shedding, store enough water in clean containers in a cool dry place away from the sun.






