It is a pleasure to get an opportunity to make a contribution to our newsletter. It is my wish that the newsletter should ultimately be one of the most effective and convenient communication media between the institution and the community. I therefore hope that we will be making progress in making the newsletter a truly community newsletter which is accessible to the target public. To achieve this, the hospital will require additional resources.

In the past three months the hospital management has focussed on shaping service delivery systems and encouraging the culture of performance within the institution. Despite a few challenges, this process has not been very difficult to facilitate. Management and financial committees were revived and annual planning was conducted. Key posts were filled to facilitate service delivery and to improve efficiency. The implementation of EPMDS received urgent attention. Work planning and performance reviews for senior managers were conducted in order to set the example for the rest of the staff. All recently appointed staff received special orientation and induction to acquaint them with hospital culture as well as to communicate the department's expectations.

The recently drafted action plans for patient experience, medical waste management, saving mothers programme, patient waiting/ service time, medical equipment etc. are all in the advanced stage of implementation. In order to deal with overflowing medical wards we have identified areas which we could use as additional patient space and thus offload the congested medical wards. We are currently renovating these areas.

The community aspect of service delivery is also receiving attention. The governance structures are encouraged through hospital board

and clinic committee meetings. We have created lay counsellor posts to improve VCT, PMTCT and ARV uptake in the community. We are investigating resources required for expansion of school health programme and to establish health posts that have been requested by the community. The Open Day was held 21 February 2007 in order to share information and to listen to the expectations of the public we serve. In this open day we recommitted ourselves as public servants and as employees of the **PEOPLE'S HOSPITAL** to meet the needs of the community.

Despite the above special projects, regular service delivery is being managed and challenges addressed.

There is one or two things I have learned – there will always be more questions than answers. There will always be more demand than supply. There will always be more said than done. The journey is not complete until we are dead.

#### PATIENTS.

A new ramp is under construction at the ARV's/TB Clinic entrance which is promising to make it easier for the physically challenged patients.

According to Sister Nandi Siyaya, CPN at the ARV clinic, it was very difficult for the sickly, disabled and the wheel chair patients to get to the clinics. Some patients are coming from wards and are in wheel chairs, pushing a wheel chair in a place where there slopes and holes is extremely difficult and dangerous especially when it was raining a day before, it becomes wet and slippery.

Getting to the clinics will now not only be easier but it will be very much safer too, the ramp will commence being in use on a very near time coming, thanks to these dedicated guys on the right who were working on a blazing Nkandla sun.

# **EZASE- CRISIS CENTER**

As Nkandla hospital social workers we render some of the following , Social assessment to HIV/ AIDS patients services

Assessments, counseling and recommendation of disability grants to clients requesting this grant. Assessment and referral to outside resources of children needing special schools, Assisting destitute patients who are not collected either from Out Patient Department or when discharged

We also assist in Making foster care placement recommendations with the department of Welfare for children who were temporally placed at the hospital, Health education for mother of malnourished children admitted or seen at Out Patient Department., Food aid assistance and linking patients with welfare in terms food relief, Neglected children follow-ups during and after their discharged from the hospital., Counseling of children with difficult behavior problems, Employee assistance programme, Alcohol/ drugs abuse counseling of patients with problems and those that are suppose to be enrolled on ARV treatment

We do Counseling of young women requesting termination of pregnancy counseling, Care dependency grant assessment

Mental care users' assessment and recommendation to psychiatric hospitals such as, looking at home circumstances, Domestic violence, depression counseling as well as counseling patients with suicidal ideations and/or attempted suicide, Preparing patients for discharge and conduct home visits and clinic visits.

Counseling relatives of deceased patients who are requesting pauper burial assistance., Counsel children and adults who are survivors of rape, sexual abuse and run support groups for sexual abused children.

Grief reaction, crisis intervention counseling and disaster management.
