

There is an alarming rise in pregnancy and substance abuse among teenagers around the country and the community we live in, the department of Health together with Chwezi Clinic and Chwezi Tribal Authority took the initiative to invite different departments such as SASSA, Department of Social Development (DSD), Department of Education, Home Affairs, Love Life, SANCA, FAMSA, Life Line, MATCH, Traditional Healer representative, and the South African Police Service came together in other to educate the young generation about the danger of substance abuse and pregnancy. It was noted that there are different factors that we addressed by our invited guests that lead to the issues that are facing teenagers, peer pressure is regarded as the most common factor that have the highest impact when substance abuse and teenage pregnancy. Poverty was also mentioned as a factor that leads to teenage pregnancy, in some instances you might have that teenager may fall pregnant because their intention is to have the child support grants and other service that are being provided by the government, the inadequate education about sexual life in children was also an issue that was raise at the awareness.

HEALTH EDUCATION SESSIONS AT OUT-PATIENTS DEPARTMENT






