ACHIEVEMENTS AT TOP CLINIC

TOP Services has achieved active functioning of the Clinic since it was opened in August 2006. The service is fully accepted by the Staff and Community, the Service has also received 97% of the equipment that was ordered. There was successful partitioning of the unit into 4 rooms namely Counselling Room, Procedure Room and 2 Recovery Rooms. The service was also marketed on the Imbizo/Open Day. Benchmarking was done in King Edward Hospital where established TOP services is running. One of the staff

members LP Zitha attended HIV Course in October 2006 which adds value to the running of the clinic.

CHALLENGES

Presently the Clinic is runned by I TOP provider, if she is on leave the clinic is closed. We also need TOP Providers with Family planning Course, Dispensing Licensing Course for smooth running of the unit. They also need a person trained for ultrasound that will be working specifically for clients coming to TOP Clinic since they

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are utilizing the services of the Radiographer who is sometimes needed at X ray.

Since the Clinic was opened as from August 2006– March 2007 they have attended to:

- Total Number of Clients seen—128 clients
- Total Number done MVA(Manual Vacuum Aspiration)-63 clients
- Clients who did not qualify for MVA (above 12 weeks)- 58 clients
- Total Number who did Family Planning– 63 clients
- Total Number Counseled– 128 clients

WHATS NEW IN THE SOCIAL WORK SERVICES extension of service with the school health team

SCHOOL HEALTH TEAM:

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had started a program of visiting schools around the Zululand Health District. The main aim of doing visits is to Identify children with Learning difficulties, Children are identified with the assistant of their Educators.

Learners could have Post Traumatic Disorders like Involved in Motor Car accidents, Domestic Violence, Rape, and Losing a family member who is a support base Financial.

If at a school there is Identified Learners, such learners are referred to the Social Work Service at the Hospital and if there is a need Social work services refer the Identified learner to be seen by Medical Officers. The Medical Officer assess the Learner and refer him/her to be seen by Clinical Psychologist . When the problem had been identified the Social worker arranges for an appointment for that learner to undergo IQ Assessment. The Social Worker then motivates for the Learner to get Financial Assistance from the Department of Social Welfare and Population Development to get a CARE DEPENDENCY GRANT so as to meet with Learner's School Fees and Boarding fee in a special Educational School.

The Social Worker negotiates with Inkanyiso Special School at VRYHEID where the learner would be based, the school also does their own assessment.

Since 2005, 15 Learners are being referred to a Special School at VRYHEID. The only problem is of Accommodation which delays the admission process.

Most of our identified learners are presently in our waiting list due to shortage of space.

CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGIST

There has been an arrangement for our Clients to be seen by our Psychosocial Therapeutic Services.

They are given a High class service by a Senior Clinical Psychologist who have, 25 years working experience dealing with Clients having Psychological difficulties like, People having Post Traumatic Disorders like people involved in Motor Vehicle Accidents, Domestic Violence, losing a Family member.

The Service is available on Wednesdays only from the Social Worker's Office. PAGE 6

Since February 2007, Eye Clinic has been visited by Optometrist Flying Doctors every last Monday of the Month.

- Eye examinations are free.
- You choose your own frame
- You pay for spectacles at the Bank

The Eye Clinic is to be visited by the Bureau For Prevention Of Blindness on the 24th of May 2007.This will be their first visit this year.

They operate cataract eyes so that people gain their sight back. This only costs at R80.00.

Spectacles only costs R60.00. These spectacles are used only for reading.

CRISES CARE CENTRE

This centre started operating in August 2006.

07:00—16:00 on daily basis and after Hours OPD Registered Nurses.

- Sexual assault

- Number of sexual abuse patients is increasing which means that people are now coming out.
- People with social problems are coming in numbers
- There is also a trained Sister in Forensic Course.
- Working hand in hand with stakeholders namely Chief Professional Nurses, Social Worker and Medical Officers.
