On the 9th of August 2021 Osindisweni Hospital celebrated a Women's Day, a day to recognize the extraordinary acts of women and to stand together, as a united force, to advance gender equality around the world.

It will never be forgotten that on the 9th of August 1956, 20 000 women from all over the country took to the streets in one of the biggest demonstrations in our county's history, in protest against Pass laws for women.

A Pass was a document of permission which allowed people of colour to enter "restricted" areas during the apartheid regime.

This year's theme for the International Day, "Women in leadership: Achieving an equal future in a COVID-19 world", celebrates the tremendous efforts by women and girls around the world in shaping a more equal future and recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic.

Osindisweni Hospital staff agreed that Women's Day is a global day celebrating the social, economic, cultural and political achievements of women.

The day also marks a call to action for accelerating gender parity. ... celebrate women's achievements, raise awareness about women's equality.

But while many people think of it as a feminist cause, its roots lie in the labour movement.






