he first CHC in uMkhanyakude Jozini CHC had a visit by the KwaZulu-Natal Legislature on the 20<sup>th</sup> June 2018. The purpose of the visit was to check the application of Government policy. Jozini CHC started operating on the 16<sup>th</sup> of April 2018 and is expected to serve a population of +-58 653 in Jozini Local Municipality. This state of the art building cost R242 millions.

The legislature commended the functionality of the facility (Jozini CHC) ) since it started operating on the 16th April 2018 and appreciated the warm welcome they received. Compliments received from the clients since the facility started operating indicate that community members are happy with services rendered. Health indicators were shared among the members of the Legislature. The community of Jozini previously were used to travel long distances for health services. The flow of patients to the neighboring hospitals (Mosvold and Bethesda) will decrease as some of their clinics will be supported by Jozini CHC.
