The idea behind this new initiative was to reduce patient waiting time.


Three patients at a time are called to the window and their medicines are dispensed to them.

LAUNCHING OF GERVICAL CANGER SCREENING







"PHILA MA" CERVICAL CANCER PRO-JECT

n the 11 of August 2009 the Department hosted the launching of Cervical Cancer screening programme at Amaoti Hall. The purpose of this programme was to create awareness to women out there that cervical cancer is on the rise in Africa at such an alarming rate, warned former National Minister of Health, Dr Manto Shabalala Msimang.

She was speaking at Amaoti Community hall where the Municipality's Health Unit and Kwazulu Natal Department of Health were launching a cervical cancer screening programme.

Kwazulu Natal Health Minister ,Dr Sbongiseni Dhlomo said women month was the perfect month to raise this crucial issue. Women are very special and most children rely on them more than their fathers and that's why we don't want to lose them.

He urged men to encourage their loved ones to go for the cervical cancer screening because the disease is preventable and could be treated.

WHY HAVE A PAP SMEAR

- Cancer of the cervix is often not detected because there are no symptoms.
- A pap smear screens for cells in the cervix
- If detected early this form of cancer can be treated effectively.

HOW IS THE PAP SMEAR TAKEN

Nurses perform a vaginal examination to take a sample from the cervix to detect any abnormalities . This is sent to the laboratory for testing.







WHO IS AT HIGH RISK

- Women who are HIV positive
- Women who have vaginal bleeding especially after sexual intercourse.
- Women who have had repeated sexually transmitted infections.
- Women who have given birth to more than five babies.
- Women who have many different partners.

IMPORTANT TIPS ON CERVICAL SCREENING

All women, 30 older should have three smears in the course of their lives or at 10 years interval. But some women needs smear more often if they are at high risk..

WHAT IS A PAP SMEAR

A pap smear is a simple test to detect cancer of the cervix (neck of the womb) it is painless and it takes only few minutes.
