- 3.1. The institution is under no obligation to accept the lowest or any quote.
- 3.2. The price quoted must include VAT (if VAT vendor). However, it must be noted that the department reserves the right to evaluate all quotations excluding VAT as some bidders may not be VAT vendors.
- 3.3. The bidder must ensure the correctness & validity of quote:

6. STATEMENT OF SUPPLIES AND SERVICES

6.1. The contractor shall, when requested to do so, furnish particulars of supplies delivered or services executed.
