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GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

1. AMENDMENT OF CONTRACT

- 1.1. Any amendment to or renunciation of the provisions of the contract shall at all times be done in writing and shall be signed by both parties.

2. CHANGE OF ADDRESS

- 2.1. Bidders must advise the Department of Health (institution where the offer was submitted) should their address (*domicilium citandi et executandi*) details change from the time of bidding to the expiry of the contract.

3. GENERAL CONDITIONS ATTACHED TO THIS QUOTATION

- 3.1. The Department is under no obligation to accept the lowest or any quote.
- 3.2. The Department reserves the right to communicate in writing with vendors in cases where information is incomplete or where there are obscurities regarding technical aspects of the offer, to obtain confirmation of prices or preference claims in cases where it is evident that a typing, written, transfer or unit error has been made, to investigate the vendor's standing and ability to complete the supply/service satisfactorily.
- 3.3. **ALL DECISIONS TAKEN BY THE DEPARTMENT ARE FINAL, INCLUDING THE AWARD OR CANCELLATION OF THIS QUOTATION.**
- 3.4. The price quoted must include VAT (if VAT vendor).
- 3.5. Should a bidder become a VAT vendor after award or during the implementation of a contract, they may not request the VAT percentage from the Department as the service provider made an offer during the period they were not registered as a VAT vendor. The Department is only liable for any VAT from registered VAT vendors as originally stated on the quotation document.
- 3.6. The bidder must ensure the correctness & validity of the quotation:
 - (i) *that the price(s), rate(s) & preference quoted cover all for the work/item (s) & accept that any mistakes regarding the price (s) & calculations will be at the bidder's risk*
 - (ii) *it is the responsibility of the bidder to confirm receipt of their quotation and to keep proof thereof.*
- 3.7. The bidder must accept full responsibility for the proper execution & fulfilment of all obligations conditions devolving on under this agreement, as the Principal (s) liable for the due fulfilment of this contract.
- 3.8. This quotation will be evaluated based on the 80/20 points system, specification, correctness of information and/or functionality criteria. All required documentation must be completed in full and submitted.
- 3.9. Offers must comply strictly with the specification.
- 3.10. Only offers that meet or are greater than the specification will be considered.
- 3.11. Late offers will not be considered.
- 3.12. Expired product/s will not be accepted. All products supplied must be valid for a minimum period of six months.
- 3.13. Used/ second-hand products will not be accepted.
- 3.14. A bidder not registered on the Central Suppliers Database or whose verification has failed will not be considered.
- 3.15. All delivery costs must be included in the quoted price for delivery at the prescribed destination.
- 3.16. Only firm prices will be accepted. Such prices must remain firm for the contract period. Non-firm prices (including rates of exchange variations) will not be considered.
- 3.17. In cases where different delivery points influence the pricing, a separate pricing schedule must be submitted for each delivery point.
- 3.18. In the event of a bidder having multiple quotes, only the cheapest according to specification will be considered.
- 3.19. Verification will be conducted to identify if bidders have multiple companies and are cover-quoting for this bid.
- 3.20. In such instances, the Department reserves the right to immediately disqualify such bidders as cover-quoting is an offence that represents both corruption and acquisition fraud.

4. SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS AND NOTICES TO BIDDERS REGARDING THE COMPLETION OF THIS QUOTATION.

- 4.1. Unless inconsistent with or expressly indicated otherwise by the context, the singular shall include the plural and vice versa and with words importing the masculine gender shall include the feminine and the neuter.
- 4.2. Under no circumstances whatsoever may the quotation/bid forms be retyped or redrafted. Photocopies of the original bid documentation may be used, but an original signature must appear on such photocopies.
- 4.3. The bidder is advised to check the number of pages and to satisfy himself that none are missing or duplicated.
- 4.4. Quotations submitted must be complete in all respects. However, where it is identified that information in a bidder's response, which does not affect the preference points or price, is incomplete in any respect, the said supplier meets all specification requirements and scores the highest points in terms of preference points and price, the Department reserves the right to request the bidder to complete/submit such information.
- 4.5. Any alteration made by the bidder must be initialled; failure to do so may render the response invalid.
- 4.6. Use of correcting fluid is prohibited and may render the response invalid.
- 4.7. Quotations will be opened in public as soon as practicable after the closing time of quotation.
- 4.8. Where practical, prices are made public at the time of opening quotations.
- 4.9. If it is desired to make more than one offer against any individual item, such offers should be given on a photocopy of the page in question. Clear indication thereof must be stated on the schedules attached.

4.10. The Department is under no obligation to pay suppliers in part for work done if the supplier can no longer for fulfil their obligation.

5. SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS REGARDING HAND DELIVERED QUOTATIONS

- 5.1. Quotation shall be lodged at the address indicated not later than the closing time specified for their receipt, and in accordance with the directives in the quotation documents.
- 5.2. Each quotation shall be addressed in accordance with the directives in the quotation documents and shall be lodged in a separate sealed envelope, with the name and address of the bidder, the quotation number and closing date indicated on the envelope. The envelope shall not contain documents relating to any quotation other than that shown on the envelope. If this provision is not complied with, such quotations/bids may be rejected as being invalid.
- 5.3. All quotations received in sealed envelopes with the relevant quotation numbers on the envelopes are kept unopened in safe custody until the closing time of the quotation/bids. Where, however, a quotation is received open, it shall be sealed. If it is received without a quotation/bid number on the envelope, it shall be opened, the quotation number ascertained, the envelope sealed and the quotation number written on the envelope.
- 5.4. A specific box is provided for the receipt of quotations, and no quotation found in any other box or elsewhere subsequent to the closing date and time of quotation will be considered.
- 5.5. No quotation/bid sent through the post will be considered if it is received after the closing date and time stipulated in the quotation documentation, and proof of posting will not be accepted as proof of delivery.
- 5.6. Quotation documents must not be included in packages containing samples. Such quotations may be rejected as being invalid.

6. SAMPLES

- 6.1. In the case of the quote document stipulating that samples are required, the supplier will be informed in due course when samples should be provided to the institution. (This decreases the time of safety and storage risk that may be incurred by the respective institution). The bidders sample will be retained if such bidder wins the contract.
 - (i) If a company/s who has not won the quote requires their samples, they must advise the institution in writing of such.
 - (ii) If samples are not collected within three months of close of quote the institution reserves the right to dispose of them at their discretion.
- 6.2. **Samples must be made available when requested in writing or if stipulated on the document.**
 - (i) If a Bidder fails to provide a sample of their product on offer for scrutiny against the set specification when requested, their offer will be rejected. All testing will be for the account of the bidder.

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8. STATEMENT OF SUPPLIES AND SERVICES

8.1. The contractor shall, when requested to do so, furnish particulars of supplies delivered or services executed. If he/she fails to do so, the Department may, without prejudice to any other rights which it may have, institute inquiries at the expense of the contractor to obtain the required particulars.

9. SUBMISSION AND COMPLETION OF SBD 6.1

9.1. Should a bidder wish to qualify for preference points they must complete a SBD 6.1 document. Failure by a bidder to provide all relevant information required, will result in such a bidder not being considered for preference point's allocation. The preferences applicable on the closing date will be utilized. Any changes after the closing date will not be considered for that particular quote.

10. TAX COMPLIANCE REQUIREMENTS

- 10.1. In the event that the tax compliance status has failed on CSD, **it is the suppliers' responsibility to provide a SARS pin in order for the institution to validate the tax compliance status of the supplier.**
- 10.2. In the event that the institution cannot validate the suppliers' tax clearance on SARS as well as the Central Suppliers Database, **the quote will not be considered and passed over as non-compliant according to National Treasury Instruction Note 4 (a) 2016/17.**

11. TAX INVOICE

11.1. A tax invoice shall be in the currency of the Republic of South Africa and shall contain the following particulars:

- (i) the name, address and registration number of the supplier;
- (ii) the name and address of the recipient;
- (iii) an individual serialized number and the date upon which the tax invoice is issued;
- (iv) a description and quantity or volume of the goods or services supplied;
- (v) the official department order number issued to the supplier;
- (vi) the value of the supply, the amount of tax charged;
- (vii) the words tax invoice in a prominent place.

12. PATENT RIGHTS

The supplier shall indemnify the **KZN Department of Health** (hereafter known as the purchaser) against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.

13. PENALTIES

- 13.1. If at any time during the contract period, the service provider is unable to perform in a timely manner, the service provider must notify the institution in writing/email of the cause of and the duration of the delay. Upon receipt of the notification, the institution should evaluate the circumstances and, if deemed necessary, the institution may extend the service provider's time for performance.
- 13.2. In the event of delayed performance that extends beyond the delivery period, the institution is entitled to purchase commodities of a similar quantity and quality as a substitution for the outstanding commodities, without terminating the contract, as well as return commodities delivered at a later stage at the service provider's expense.
- 13.3. Alternatively, the institution may elect to terminate the contract and procure the necessary commodities in order to complete the contract. In the event that the contract is terminated the institution may claim damages from the service provider in the form of a penalty. The service provider's performance should be captured on the service provider database in order to determine whether or not the service provider should be awarded any contracts in the future.
- 13.4. If the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the services within the period(s) specified in the contract, the purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed goods or unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance.

14. TERMINATION FOR DEFAULT

- 14.1. The purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, may terminate this contract in whole or in part:
 - (i) if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods within the period(s) specified in the contract,
 - (ii) if the supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract; or
 - (iii) if the supplier, in the judgment of the purchaser, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the contract.
- 14.2. In the event the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, goods, works or services similar to those undelivered, and the supplier shall be liable to the purchaser for any excess costs for such similar goods, works or services.
- 14.3. Where the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may decide to impose a restriction penalty on the supplier by prohibiting such supplier from doing business with the public sector for a period not exceeding 10 years.

On behalf of Ngwelezana Tertiary Hospital, we hereby invite you to quote for the below services as per specification.

INSTALLATION OF TWO 55 kg INDUSTRIAL DRYER MACHINES AT NGWELEZANA HOSPITAL

1. TECHNICAL SPECIFICATION

1.1 GENERAL

This TECHNICAL SPECIFICATION shall be read in conjunction with all other sections of the SPECIFICATION and cognisance shall be taken of the clauses relevant to this particular installation, whether any specific clauses are referred to or not. **Note to Contractors:**

1. Works to be completed within 14 working days from receiving an official order.
2. Office to be notified in advance to arrange for an onsite inspection after completion of the installation so as to finalize the payment.
3. The scope of work/ specifications is specific to Ngwelezana Hospital and all bidders are required to attend the compulsory site briefing.
4. No work can commence without prior authorisation by the Chief Artisan of the Facility.
5. A kick off meeting is compulsory and the bidder who will be awarded the job must notify the Facility Chief Artisan in charge of the start date so that a kick-off meeting can be scheduled and conducted three days before the work start date.
6. A compulsory site briefing shall be held before services providers submits their bids
7. **The following items to be quoted on:**
 - Supply, install and electrically terminate the industrial dryer with all associated plumbing.
 - Supply, install and electrically terminate the industrial tumble dryer with all associated necessary plumbing.
 - Upgrade and rewire the laundry distribution boards.
 - Upgrading of the electrical supply to the laundry to cater for the additional load.
 - Testing, commissioning and providing certificate of compliance for the whole installation

2. NOTES TO BIDDERS

1. All work is to be carried out to the approval of the department by skilled and qualified workmen and in accordance with the methods prescribed in SABS code of practice.
2. Contractors are urged to ensure that safety measures as per the Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) Act are in place before any work is undertaken.
3. All dimensions and sizes shall be checked and confirmed before any work is undertaken or materials ordered. Any discrepancies shall be brought to the attention of the project leader immediately.
4. All work is to be carried out as per the Bill of Quantities (BOQ) and technical specifications as issued with this document-no alterations will be allowed unless the project leader grants prior authority.

5. The Department of Health reserves the right to negotiate prices in the Bill of Quantities.
6. All materials used in this contract shall be that which is specified or other approved.
7. Contractors are advised to visit site to acquaint themselves with the site and the layout of the institution as no claims on the grounds of ignorance of the locality/siting or access to the institution will be entertained later.
8. Contractors are informed that living on the institutions premises during the contract is not allowed and arrangements for accommodation will have to be made.
9. All rates for items contained in this Schedule of Prices must be computed **excluding** the applicable VAT.
10. All rates quoted shall be inclusive of transport, labour and profit but exclude VAT.
11. All work is to be executed in accordance with the instructions issued by the manufacturer of the material/equipment being used.
12. The institution is fully functional and occupied. Care must be exercised that daily functioning of the institution and safety of staff and visitors is not compromised in any way.
13. The whole installation shall be in accordance with the Occupational Health and Safety Act 85/1993 as amended and all regulations framed therein shall be carried out to the satisfaction of the Department of Health.
14. Competent workmen skilled in their trade shall carry out all work. Quality shall be of the best standard practice and all workmanship will be subject to the approval of the Department of Health.
15. The work shall at all times, for the duration of the contract, be carried out under supervision of a skilled and competent representative of the Service Provider, who will be able and authorized to receive and carry out instructions on behalf of the of the Service Provider. A sufficient number of workmen shall be employed at all times to ensure satisfactory progress of the work.
16. All apparatus, component parts, fittings and materials employed in the execution of the Contract shall be new and unused and shall be the latest type or pattern of the particular manufacture employed and SABS approved. S.A.B.S. mark bearing items shall be used wherever possible.
17. The complete installation shall be maintained as specified in this particular specification after acceptance in writing by the Department of Health.
18. The complete installation must be guaranteed against defective parts and workmanship for the period specified after the date of issue of the Completion Certificate. This period shall run concurrently with the maintenance period.
19. Tenderers are advised to visit the site and acquaint themselves fully with the site conditions and nature and full extent of work involved prior to submitting their bid. Claims on the grounds of insufficient information in such respects or otherwise will not be entertained by the Administration.
20. The Department of Health reserves the right to make emergency repairs to keep the equipment in operation without voiding the Contractor's Guarantee, nor relieving the Contractor of his/her responsibility during the guarantee period when, after proper notice, the Contractor fails to attend to such emergency repairs. All costs incurred by the administration under these circumstances will be for the account of the Contractor.
21. The bidder will not be adjudicated on the Price only. The bidders will be adjudicated based on the cheapest COMPETENT, RESOURCED and COMPLIANT bidder
22. With effect from the date of the First Delivery Certificate the Contractor shall at his own expense undertake the regular servicing of the installation during the maintenance period and shall make all adjustments necessary for the correct operation thereof. If during the said period the installations is not in working order for any reason for which the Contractor is responsible, or if the installations

develops defects, he shall immediately upon being notified thereof take steps to remedy the defects and make any necessary adjustments. Should such stoppages however be so frequent as to become troublesome, or should the installations otherwise prove unsatisfactory during the said period the Contractor shall, if called upon by the Department, at his own expense replace the whole of the installations or such parts thereof as the Department may deem necessary with apparatus specified by the Department.

23. Preference will be given to Bidders who have registered offices / workshops within the borders of the Province of KwaZulu-Natal. This is in an effort to reduce response times to call outs for breakdowns in the more remote areas of the Province.

24. The Contractor must be registered with CIDB and must have minimum grading of 2ME/EB.

3. SCHEDULE OF RATES

3.1 ITEMS AND PRICING

The Department reserves the right to place an order for any quantities of items included in the Schedules. The Schedule of Rates must also not be assumed to include and describe every detail of the supply requirement, but must be taken and read in conjunction with the other parts of the document and relevant standards taken into consideration. Thus the supplier shall not have claim for further payment in respect of any order which may be described or implied in the contract, although apparently no corresponding items are given in the Schedule of Rates. The supplier shall be deemed to have satisfied himself before quoting as to the correctness and sufficiency of his quote for the contract and of the rates and prices stated in the Schedule of Rates.

3.2 TAX AND DUTIES

Prices, quoted and paid, must include all customs, excise and import duties, and any other tariffs or taxes levied by the government or statutory body having jurisdiction on the goods provided under this contract, **including Value Added Tax (applicable to the current rate).**

3.3 RATES

Except where provision is made in the Schedule of Rates, the rates and prices inserted shall be the full rates and prices for the service delivered described under the respective items and shall cover all labour, transport, overhead charges and profit, etc. as well as the general liabilities, obligations and risks arising out of the Conditions of Contract, the overhead charges and profit being spread proportionately over the rates of the relative items in the Schedule of Rates.

4. STANDARDS and REGULATIONS

The supply and installation of the access doors and its associated equipment specified, must comply with the latest requirements of:

- i) The Occupational Health and Safety Act (Act 85, 1993) as amended.
- ii) IUSS Health Facilities Guide
- iii) Kwazulu-Natal Department Of Health - Policy Document For The Design Of Electrical Installations
- iv) Kwazulu-Natal Department Of Health - Policy Document For The Design Of Mechanical Installations
- v) SANS 10472 - Safety requirements for industrial laundry machinery
- vi) SANS 10146:2012 – Laundry processes and management
- vii) SANS 10400: The application of the National Building Regulations (especially part O, T & XA)
- viii) SANS 14644: Clean rooms and associated controlled environments (Part 1 and Part 2)
- ix) SANS 60947-1: 2005/IEC 60947-1: 2004 to SANS 60947-8: 2004/IEC 60947-8: 2004: Low voltage switch gear and control gear.
- x) An Electrical Certificate of Compliance, in accordance with the OHS Act as amended, will be required for all Electrical Works.

5. PROGRAMMING OF WORKS

- Contractor shall finish this work within (21) days counting from the date of site handover, unless other strong and valid reason is stated.
- Itemized billing of the detailed break-down will be required and approved by the Project Leader before any construction can commence. Itemized billing of the detailed break-down will assist in ensuring that the contractor has quoted or covered all the specified work and parts. The itemized billing must be done in a separate page on letter head & signed or separate page stamped & signed. The Bills of Quantities will also indicate the other associated costs, e.g. electrical connections and Certificate of Compliance etc.
- It is imperative that the installation be achieved with minimum interruption to the existing facility.

- The contractor shall notify the institution seven (7) days prior to carrying out any site work. As the institution is to remain in full operation for the duration of the works, the works are to be planned and executed so as to cause minimum inconvenience to staff and visitors.
- A program WILL BE submitted prior to the commencement of any work for the approval by the Project Leader. No work will commence without the program of works having been approved by the Project Leader.

6. TESTING AND COMMISSIONING

The areas shall be inspected, laundry machines tested before handing over to Department of Health: Chief Artisan. There shall be an inspection program submitted to the DoH Engineer by the service provider prior to the testing and commissioning and the tests and commissioning shall be witnessed by the Department of Health: Provincial Infrastructure Engineer or his/her representatives.

7. THE SITE

The site is Ngwelezane Hospital in the King Cetshwayo District.

8. MAINTENANCE AND SERVICING

The entire installation including all new equipment manufactured or bought is subject to an unrestricted 12-month free maintenance and guarantee period, after the date of issue of the Completion Certificate.

This also includes cover pertaining to all aspects of the equipment and associated wiring, piping, controls etc. During the 12-month maintenance and servicing period any defects which are related to the recently done repairs shall be made good and all plant and equipment maintained in perfect operating condition.

9. SCOPE OF WORK and SCHEDULE OF PRICES

Electrical installation

- 1) Supply, install and lay the electric cables feeding the laundry equipment, inclusive conduits, terminations, breakers , lugs, etc.
- 2) Supply, install, electrically connect and terminate the safety devices (circuit breakers and isolators) for the laundry equipment (where applicable).
- 3) Upgrade the laundry distribution boards. Install new circuit breakers (including main incomer circuit breaker upgrade) and re-wire the DB to adhere and comply with relevant SANS regulations. Supply, install and terminate all equipment for the upgrade of the laundry distribution upgrade to cater for additional loads.
- 4) Commission and provide certificate of compliance for all electrical installations in the Laundry.

All installations must comply with the DOH's electrical installation policy, SANS10142-1 and 2

Mechanical installation

- 1) Supply, deliver, install and commissioning of two (2) x 55 kg heavy duty industrial microprocessor controlled tumble dryer, with over dry prevention technology and reversing drum. The machine must be suitable for 380/400 volts electricity supply. Maximum Machine dimensions (w x d x h) 1200 mm x 1800 mm x 2200 mm, Net weight: 630kg. **NB** remove the old spinner machine to replace with the new dryer.
