PART FOUR - TECHNICAL SPECIFICATION

- 4.1 All installation work is to be carried out in accordance with the Department of Health Standard Specification for the Installation of external structures
- 4.2 All Steel galvanised sliding gate, security boom gate and accessories assemblies and installations are to comply with SANS 10400 and all applicable SANS standards.
- 4.3 The Contractor should fully familiarise himself with these documents prior to quoting.
- 4.4 Equipment Schedules of all parts and equipment forming part of the works are required and must be included in the manual. The schedule shall include, but shall not be restricted to the following data:

Maintenance Requirements the manufacturer's recommendation with regard to the routine servicing and maintenance of all equipment shall be included in the manual. This data shall include the recommended service interval and the estimated hours required for each type of service, for each item of equipment, together with a list of agents/contractors authorised to carry out such service/maintenance.

GENERAL

This Technical Specification shall be read in conjunction with all other sections of the specification and cognisance shall be taken of the clauses relevant to this particular installation, whether any specific clauses are referred to or not.

5. PARTICULAR SPECIFICATION

5.1 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

Tenderers are to make special note of the following:

The whole installation shall be in accordance with the Occupational Health and Safety Act 85 of 1993 and all regulations framed therein shall be carried out to the satisfaction of the Department of Health.

Competent workmen skilled in their trade shall carry out all work. Quality shall be of the best standard practice and all workmanship will be subject to the approval of the Department of Health.

The work shall at all times, for the duration of the contract, be carried out under the supervision of a skilled and competent representative of the Contractor, who will be



able and authorized to receive and carry out instructions on behalf of the Contractor. A sufficient number of workmen shall be employed at all times to ensure satisfactory progress of the work.

All apparatus, component parts, fittings and materials employed in the execution of the Contract shall be new and unused and shall be the latest type or pattern of the particular manufacture employed. S.A.B.S. mark bearing items shall be used wherever possible.

The complete installation must be guaranteed against defective parts and workmanship for a period of twelve months after the date of issue of the Completion Certificate. This period shall run concurrently with the maintenance period.

Rates are to include for commissioning and testing of the complete installation and handing over in working order ready for use.

Tenderers are advised to visit the site and acquaint themselves fully with the site conditions and nature and full extent of work involved prior to submitting their tender. Claims on the grounds of insufficient information in such respects or otherwise will not be entertained by the Administration.

The Administration reserves the right to make emergency repairs to keep the equipment in operation without voiding the Contractor's Guarantee, nor relieving the Contractor of his responsibility during the guarantee period when, after proper notice, the Contractor fails to attend to such emergency repairs. All costs incurred by the Administration under these circumstances will be for the account of the Contractor.



5.2 SCOPE OF WORKS

5.2.1 Steel sliding gate specification

- Remove the existing sliding steel galvanised gate
- Install new galvanised steel gate which will match the existing one
- Remove damaged round bar flat roller and install new
- Use the existing frame work to support the new installed gate

5.2.2 Security Boom gate Technical specification (x2 Separated Boom Gates)

Remote control barrier boom gate specification

- -Supply and install new remote control barriers boom gate
- -Aluminium round profile, epoxy coated white, red and white reflective tape
- -Each barrier arm bar will spans an opening, raised and lowered between each vehicle passing through check point and serve as an efficient way to manage traffic flow, quickly admitting vehicles.
- -Barrier arm must be operated by means of:
 - ✓ Pushing
 - ✓ Remote control
 - ✓ RFID tags/ RFID reader
 - ✓ Loop detectors
 - ✓ Opto-electronic sensor

- -Each barrel must have a lockable mechanism when it is lifted upwards.



NOTES

The purpose of this document is to:

- Draw special attention to certain general conditions applicable to government bids, contracts and orders; and
- To ensure that clients be familiar with regard to the rights and obligations of all parties involved in doing business with government. (ii)

In this document words in the singular also mean in the plural and vice versa and words in the masculine also mean in the feminine and neuter.

- The General Conditions of Contract will form part of all bid/quotation documents and may not be amended.
- Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) relevant to a specific bid, should be compiled separately for every bid (if applicable) and will supplement the General Conditions of Contract, Whenever there is a conflict, the provisions in the SCC shall prevail.


Definitions 1

The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:

- "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
- "Contract' means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- "Contract price" means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
- "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
- "Countervailing duttes" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally.
- "Country of origin" means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced 1.6. when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.
- "Day" means calendar day,
- "Delivery" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order, 1,8,
- "Delivery ex stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand. 1.9.
- "Delivery into consignees store or to his site" means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compilance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier bearing all risks and charges involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained. 1.10.
- "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and 1.11. which have the potential to harm the local industries in the RSA
- "Force majeure" means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foreseeable. Such events may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions 1.12. and freight embargoes.
- "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive 1.13. levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract, 1.14.
- "Goods" means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract. 1.15.
- "Imported content" means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be Imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs 1.16. imported (whether by the supplier of his subconfluctors) and which costs are inclusive of the Costs added, plus freight and other direct importation and such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.
- "Local content" means that portion of the bidding price which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place. 1.17.
- "Manufacture" means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding 1.18.
- *Order" means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service. 1,19,
- *Project site, * where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents. 1,20,
- "Purchaser" means the organization purchasing the goods. 1.21.
- "Republic" means the Republic of South Africa. 1.22.
- "SGC" means the Special Conditions of Contract. 1.23.
- "Services" means those functional services ancillary to the supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, calering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the 1.24. supplier covered under the contract.
- "Written" or "in writing" means handwritten in ink or any form of electronic or mechanical writing. 1.25.

- These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services, sales, hiring, letting and the granting or acquiring of rights, but excluding immovable property, unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents. 2.1.
- Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific supplies, services or works. 22.
- Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply. 2.3.

- Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a 3 3.1. bid. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged,
- With certain exceptions, invitations to bid are only published in the Government Tender Bulletin. The Government Tender Bulletin may be obtained 3.2. directly from the Government Printer, Private Bag X85, Pretoria 0001, or accessed electronically from www.treasury.gov.za



- The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.
- Use of contract documents and information; inspection.
- The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewilh, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be 5.1.
- The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for 5 2.
- Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5,1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser. 5.3.
- The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors 5.4. appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser,

The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use 6.1. of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.

- Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security of the 7.1.
- The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete 7.2.
- The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall 7.3.
 - (a) a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the be in one of the following forms: purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser; or
- The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and returned to the supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the supplier's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise specified in SCC. 7.4.

Inspections, tests and analyses

- If the supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified in SCC, the purchaser may proceed to take such remedial action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the purchaser may have against the supplier under the contract.
