The purpose of this decument is to:

- (f) Draw special attention to certain general conditions applicable to government bids, contracts and orders; and
- (ii) To ensure that clears be familiar with regard to the rights and obligations of all parties involved in during business with government.

- The General Conditions of Contract will form part of all bid/quotation documents and may not be antended.
- Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) relevant to a specific bid, should be compiled separately for every bid (# applicable) and will supplement the
 General Conditions of Contract. Whenever there is a conflict, the provisions in the SCC shall prevail.

1 Definitions

The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:


- 1.1. "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of blds.
- 1.2. "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all decements incorporated by reference therein.
- 1.3. "Contract price" means the orice payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of the contraction of the contract price.
- 1.4. "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official is the procurement process or in position execution.
- 1.5. "Counterwiding dubes" are Imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally.
- 1.9. "Country of origin? means the place where the goods were milited, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. - 1.7. "Day" means calendar day.

4 Standards

4.1. The goods supplied shall conferm to the abundands mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.

5 Use of contract documents and information; hispection.

- 5.1. The supplier shall not without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewite, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such engaged person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be necessary for our poses of such performance.
- 5.2. The supplier shall got, without the purphaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for purposes of performing the contract.
- 5.3. Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the aupplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.
- 5.4 The supplier shall permit the parchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the perchaser, if so required by the perchaser.

6 Patent rights

6.1. The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringestent of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.

7 Performance security

- 7.1. Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the seccessful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security of the amount specified in SCC.
- 7.2. The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete his obligations order the contract.

8 Inspections, tests and analyses

9 Packing

- 15.2. This warranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and excepted at the final destination indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of leading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise in SCC.
- 15.3. The porchaser shall promptly notify the supplier in writing of any claims arising ender this warranty.
- 15.4. Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified in SCC and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser.

If the supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified in SCC, the purchaser may proceed to take such remedial action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the perchaser may have against the supplier under the contract.

16 Payment
