



GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

NOTES

The purpose of this document is to:

- Draw special attention to certain general conditions applicable to government bids, contracts and orders; and
- To ensure that clients be familiar with regard to the rights and obligations of all parties involved in doing business with government.

In this document words in the singular also mean in the plural and vice versa and words in the masculine also mean in the feminine and neuter,

- The General Conditions of Contract will form part of all bid/quotation documents and may not be amended.
- Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) relevant to a specific bid, should be compiled separately for every bid (if applicable) and will supplement the General Conditions of Contract. Whenever there is a conflict, the provisions in the SCC shall prevail.

Definitions

The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:

- "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
- "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference thereto.
 "Contract price" means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations. 1,2,

- "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement
- process or in contract execution.

 "Countervalling duties" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products 1.5. internationally.
- *Country of origin' means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied, Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and insign assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components. 1.6.

- "Day" means calendar day.

- "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition. 1,13,

- These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services, sales, hiring, letting and the granting or acquiring of rights, but excluding immovable property, unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents. Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific supplies, services or works. 2.1.
- 2.2. Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply.

- Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a 3.1. bkt. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged.
- With certain exceptions, invitations to bid are only published in the Government Tender Builetin. The Government Tender Builetin may be obtained directly from the Government Printer, Private Bag X85, Pretoila 0001, or accessed electronically from www.treasury.gov.za 3,2.



Standards

- The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications. 4,1.
- Use of contract documents and information; inspection.
- The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be 5.1. necessary for purposes of such performance,
- The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior willen consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for 5.2. purposes of performing the contract.
- Any document, other then the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract it so required by the purchaser.
- The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser. 5,4.
