GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

GCC

NOTES

The purpose of this document is to:

- Draw special attention to certain general conditions applicable to government bids, contracts and orders; and (i)
- To ensure that clients be familiar with regard to the rights and obligations of all parties involved in doing business with government. (ii)

In this document words in the singular also mean in the plural and vice versa and words in the masculine also mean in the feminine and neuter.

- The General Conditions of Contract will form part of all bid/quotation documents and may not be amended.
- Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) relevant to a specific bid, should be compiled separately for every bid (if applicable) and will supplement the General Conditions of Contract, Whenever there is a conflict, the provisions in the SCC shall prevail.

1 Definitions

The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:

- "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
- 1.1. "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- "Contract price" means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations. 1.3.
- "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement 1.4. process or in contract execution.
- . "Countervalling duties" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products 1.5. internationally.
- "Country of origin" means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced 1.6. when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.
- 1.7. "Day" means calendar day.
- "Delivery" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order. 1.8.
- "Delivery ex stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand. 1,9,
- "Delivery into consignees store or to his site" means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the 1.10. conditions of the contract or order, the supplier bearing all risks and charges involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.
- "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and 1 11 which have the potential to harm the tocal industries in the RSA
- "Force majeure" means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foreseeable. Such events 1.12. may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.
- "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of 1.13. any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract. 1.14.
- "Goods" means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract, 1.15.
- "Imported content" means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be 1.16. imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.
- "Local content" means that portion of the bidding price which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place. 1.17.
- "Manufacture" means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding 1.18. activities.
- "Order" means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service. 1.19.
- "Project site," where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents. 1,20,
- "Purchaser" means the organization purchasing the goods, 1.21.
- "Republic" means the Republic of South Africa, 1.22.
- "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract. 1.23.
- "Services" means those functional services ancillary to the supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as 1.24. installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the
- "Written" or "in writing" means handwritten in ink or any form of electronic or mechanical writing. 1,25,

- These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services, sales, hiring, letting and 2.1. the granting or acquiring of rights, but excluding immovable property, unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents.
- Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific supplies, services or works. 2,2.
- Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply. 2,3.

- Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a 3.1. bid. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged.

The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.

Use of contract documents and information; inspection.

- The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, 5.1. pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.
- The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for 5.2. purposes of performing the contract.
- Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to 5.3, the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.
- The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors 5.4. appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.

The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use 6.1. of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.

Performance security

- Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security of the 7.1.
- The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete 7.2. his obligations under the contract.
- The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall 7.3. be in one of the following forms:
 - (a) a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser, or
 - (b) a cashier's or certified cheque
- The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and returned to the supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion 7.4. of the supplier's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

Inspections, tests and analyses

- All pre-bidding testing will be for the account of the bidder. 8.1.
- If it is a bid condition that supplies to be produced or services to be rendered should at any stage during production or execution or on completion be 8.2. subject to inspection, the premises of the bidder or contractor shall be open, at all reasonable hours, for inspection by a representative of the Department or an organization acting on behalf of the Department.
- If there are no inspection requirements indicated in the bidding documents and no mention is made in the contract, but during the contract period it is 8.3. decided that inspections shall be carried out, the purchaser shall itself make the necessary arrangements, including payment arrangements with the testing authority concerned.
- If the inspections, tests and analyses referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 show the supplies to be in accordance with the contract requirements, the cost of 8.4. the inspections, tests and analyses shall be defrayed by the purchaser.
- Where the supplies or services referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 do not comply with the contract requirements, irrespective of whether such supplies or 8.5. services are accepted or not, the cost in connection with these inspections, tests or analyses shall be defrayed by the supplier.
- Supplies and services which are referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 and which do not comply with the contract requirements may be rejected. 8.6.
- Any contract supplies may on or after delivery be inspected, tested or analyzed and may be rejected if found not to comply with the requirements of the 8.7. contract. Such rejected supplies shall be held at the cost and risk of the supplier who shall, when called upon, remove them immediately at his own cost and forthwith substitute them with supplies which do comply with the requirements of the contract. Failing such removal the rejected supplies shall be returned at the suppliers cost and risk. Should the supplier fail to provide the substitute supplies forthwith, the purchaser may, without giving the supplier further opportunity to substitute the rejected supplies, purchase such supplies as may be necessary at the expense of the supplier.
- The provisions of clauses 8.4 to 8,7 shall not prejudice the right of the purchaser to cancel the contract on account of a breach of the conditions thereof, 8.8. or to act in terms of Clause 23 of GCC.

- The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as 9.1. indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.
- The packing, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly 9.2. provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, if any, specified in SCC, and in any subsequent instructions ordered by the purchaser.

Delivery and documents

- Delivery of the goods shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the terms specified in the contract. The details of shipping and/or other 10.1. documents to be furnished by the supplier are specified in SCC.

The goods supplied under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or 11.1. acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery in the manner specified in the SCC.



12 Transportation

12.1. Should a price other than an all-inclusive delivered price be required, this shall be specified in the SCC.

13 Incidental services

- 13.1. The supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following services, including additional services, if any, specified in SCC:
 - (a) performance or supervision of on-site assembly and/or commissioning of the supplied goods;
 - (b) furnishing of tools required for assembly and/or maintenance of the supplied goods;
 - (c) furnishing of a detailed operations and maintenance manual for each appropriate unit of the supplied goods;
 - (d) performance or supervision or maintenance and/or repair of the supplied goods, for a period of time agreed by the parties, provided that this service shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under this contract; and
 - (e) training of the purchaser's personnel, at the supplier's plant and/or on-site, in assembly, start-up, operation, maintenance, and/or repair of the
- 13.2. Prices charged by the supplier for incidental services, if not included in the contract price for the goods, shall be agreed upon in advance by the parties and shall not exceed the prevailing rates charged to other parties by the supplier for similar services.

14 Spare parts

As specified in SCC, the supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following materials, notifications, and information pertaining to spare parts 14.1. manufactured or distributed by the supplier:

- (a) such spare parts as the purchaser may elect to purchase from the supplier, provided that this election shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under the contract; and
- (b) in the event of termination of production of the spare parts:
 - (i) Advance notification to the purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the purchaser to procure needed requirements; and
 - (ii) following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the purchaser, the blueprints, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested.

15 Warranty

- 15.1. The supplier warrants that the goods supplied under the contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract. The supplier further warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any act or omission of the supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination.
- 15.2. This warranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise in SCC.
- 15.3. The purchaser shall promptly notify the supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty.
- 15.4. Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified in SCC and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser.
- 15.5. If the supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified in SCC, the purchaser may proceed to take such remedial action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the purchaser may have against the supplier under the contract.

16 Payment

- 16.1. The method and conditions of payment to be made to the supplier under this contract shall be specified in SCC.
- 16.2. The supplier shall furnish the purchaser with an invoice accompanied by a copy of the delivery note and upon fulfillment of other obligations stipulated in the contract.
- 16.3. Payments shall be made promptly by the purchaser, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of an invoice or claim by the supplier.
- Payment will be made in Rand unless otherwise stipulated in SCC.

17 Prices

17.1. Prices charged by the supplier for goods delivered and services performed under the contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the supplier in his bid, with the exception of any price adjustments authorized in SCC or in the purchaser's request for bid validity extension, as the case may be.

18 Contract amendments

18.1. No variation in or modification of the terms of the contract shall be made except by written amendment signed by the parties concerned.

19 Assignment

19.1. The supplier shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform under the contract, except with the purchaser's prior written consent,

20 Subcontracts

20.1. The supplier shall notify the purchaser in writing of all subcontracts awarded under this contracts if not already specified in the bid. Such notification, in the original bid or later, shall not relieve the supplier from any liability or obligation under the contract.

21 Delays in the supplier's performance

- 21.1. Delivery of the goods and performance of services shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the purchaser in the contract.
- 21.2. If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the supplier's notice, the purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may at his discretion extend the supplier's time for performance, with or without the imposition of penalties, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.
- 21.3. No provision in a contract shall be deemed to prohibit the obtaining of supplies or services from a national department, provincial department, or a local authority.
- 21.4. The right is reserved to procure outside of the contract small quantities or to have minor essential services executed if an emergency arises, the supplier's point of supply is not situated at or near the place where the supplies are required, or the supplier's services are not readily available.



- 21.5. Except as provided under GCC Clause 25, a delay by the supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render the supplier liable to the imposition of penalties, pursuant to GCC Clause 22, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2 without the application of penalties.
- 21.6. Upon any delay beyond the delivery period in the case of a supplies contract, the purchaser shall, without canceling the contract, be entitled to purchase supplies of a similar quality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods delivered later at the supplier's expense and risk, or to cancel the contract and buy such goods as may be required to complete the contract and without prejudice to his other rights, be entitled to claim damages from the supplier.

22 Penalties

22.1. Subject to GCC Clause 25, if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the services within the period(s) specified in the contract, the purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed goods or unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance. 23 Termination for default

However, the supplier shall continue performance of the contract to the extent not terminated.
- 23.3. Where the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may decide to impose a restriction penalty on the supplier by prohibiting such supplier from doing business with the public sector for a period not exceeding 10 years.
- 23.4. If a purchaser intends imposing a restriction on a supplier or any person associated with the supplier, the supplier will be allowed a time period of not more than fourteen (14) days to provide reasons why the envisaged restriction should not be imposed. Should the supplier fail to respond within the stipulated fourteen (14) days the purchaser may regard the intended penalty as not objected against and may impose it on the supplier.
- 23.5. Any restriction imposed on any person by the Accounting Officer / Authority will, at the discretion of the Accounting Officer / Authority, also be applicable to any other enterprise or any partner, manager, director or other person who wholly or partly exercises or exercised or may exercise control over the enterprise of the first-mentioned person, and with which enterprise or person the first-mentioned person, is or was in the opinion of the Accounting Officer / Authority actively associated.
- 23.6. If a restriction is imposed, the purchaser must, within five (5) working days of such imposition, furnish the National Treasury, with the following information:
 - (i) the name and address of the supplier and / or person restricted by the purchaser;
 - (ii) the date of commencement of the restriction
 - (iii) the period of restriction; and
 - (iv) the reasons for the restriction.
- These details will be loaded in the National Treasury's central database of suppliers or persons prohibited from doing business with the public sector.

 23.7. If a court of law convicts a person of an offence as contemplated in sections 12 or 13 of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act, No. 12 of 2004, the court may also rule that such person's name be endorsed on the Register for Tender Defaulters. When a person's name has been endorsed on the Register, the person will be prohibited from doing business with the public sector for a period not less than five years and not more than 10 years. The National Treasury is empowered to determine the period of restriction and each case will be dealt with on its own merits. According to section 32 of the Register must be open to the public. The Register can be perused on the National Treasury website.

24 Anti-dumping and countervailing duties and rights

24.1. When, after the date of bid, provisional payments are required, or antidumping or countervailing duties are imposed, or the amount of a provisional payment or anti-dumping or countervailing right is increased in respect of any dumped or subsidized import, the State is not liable for any amount so required or imposed, or for the amount of any such increase. When, after the said date, such a provisional payment is no longer required or any such admiping or countervailing right is abolished, or where the amount of such provisional payment or any such right is reduced, any such favourable difference shall on demand be paid forthwith by the contractor to the State or the State may deduct such amounts from moneys (if any) which may otherwise be due to the contractor in regard to supplies or services which he delivered or rendered, or is to deliver or render in terms of the contract or any other amount whichmay be due to him.

25 Force Majeure

- 25.1. Notwithstanding the provisions of GCC Clauses 22 and 23, the supplier shall not be liable for forfeiture of its performance security, damages, or termination for default if and to the extent that his delay in performance or other failure to perform his obligations under the contract is the result of an event of force majeure.
- 25.2. If a force majeure situation arises, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the purchaser in writing, the supplier shall continue to perform its obligations under the contract as far as is reasonably practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the force majeure event.

26 Termination for insolvency

26.1. The purchaser may at any time terminate the contract by giving written notice to the supplier if the supplier becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In this event, termination will be without compensation to the supplier, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the purchaser.

27 Settlement of Disputes

27.1. If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever arises between the purchaser and the supplier in connection with or arising out of the contract, the parties shall make every effort to resolve amicably such dispute or difference by mutual consultation.

All apparatus, component parts, fittings and materials employed in the execution of the Contract shall be new and unused and shall be the latest type or pattern of the particular manufacture employed. S.A.B.S. mark bearing items shall be used wherever possible.

The complete installation shall be maintained as specified in this particular specification after acceptance in writing by the Department of Health.

The complete installation must be guaranteed against defective parts and workmanship for the period specified after the date of issue of the Completion Certificate.

Rates are to include for commissioning and testing of the complete installation and handing over in working order ready for use.

Tenderers are advised to visit the site and acquaint themselves fully with the site conditions and nature and full extent of work involved prior to submitting their bid. Claims on the grounds of insufficient information in such respects or otherwise will not be entertained by the Administration.

The Department of Health reserves the right to make emergency repairs to keep the equipment in operation without voiding the Contractor's Guarantee, nor relieving the Contractor of his/her responsibility during the guarantee period when, after proper notice, the Contractor fails to attend to such emergency repairs. All costs incurred by the administration under these circumstances will be for the account of the Contractor.

6.4. CONTRACT PERIOD

The contract period is 8 weeks from the awarding of the job.

6.5. DESCRIPTION OF THE WORKS

6.5.1 Equipment

Equipment details to be discussed during the site briefing.

6.5.2 Quoted Service Price

The quoted service price shall be inclusive of all, preamble and generals, materials, labour, consumables, corrosion treatment, paint work, supervision, administration, overhead costs, insurance, profit, printing of service schedules, travel, transport, attendance to site meetings etc.

6.5.5 Program of Works

The successful bidders shall submit his/her program of works, for review and acceptance, to the Department's Representative 2 days prior to commencement of the works.

6.5.6 Access to Site

Access for construction shall be by arrangement with the official in charge (Facility Manager) on site. No claims arising from the contractor failing to make prior arrangement for access to the site will be entertained.

6.5.7 Commencement of Work and Official Order

Work shall only commence on receipt, by the service provider, of an official order and after program of works has been discussed with the Departments representative and site handover performed accordingly from Facility to Service provider

6.5.8 Health and Safety Requirements

It is required that a project specific Health and Safety Plan, for the work to be executed under this project, shall be submitted for approval, by the Department's Representative, before any work commences.

6.5.9 Familiarization with the Site

Bidders are required to familiarize themselves with the site. Claims on the grounds of lack of acknowledge, in such respect, or otherwise, will not be entertained.

6.5.10 Co-Ordination

The contractor shall co-ordinate the works in liaison with the Department's Representative.

6.5.11 Disruptions on Site

The minimum of disruption to the functioning of the site facilities is required.

6.5.12 <u>Cleanliness on Site</u>

Due diligence is to be exercised, at all times, in respect of cleanliness in the work area.

6.5.13 Guarantee Period

- a) The Service Provider shall unconditionally guarantee work performed for a period of twelve (12) months from the date of acceptance of the Works from the date of the First Delivery Certificate.
- b) The Service Provider shall unconditionally guarantee all new, replacement or additional equipment, and installations (inclusive of all electrical components) for a minimum period of twelve (12) months.

- c) The guarantee shall cover the performance of the Works and any defects due to inferior materials and/or workmanship of the Service Provider, or any of his/her Sub-Contractors, fair wear and tear excepted, and the Service Provider shall repair any such defects without delay and at his/her own cost. This guarantee shall include, structural integrity compromised, leaks, cracks, loose joints etc.
- d) Should any part of the complete Works perform unsatisfactorily so as to become detrimental to its functional use the service provider shall replace any such part of the complete Works with equipment as prescribed by the Employer without delay and at his/her own cost.
- e) If any defects are not remedied within the period specified by the Employer, the Employer shall have such defect repaired at the risk and cost of the Service Provider, by another service provider whom the employer deems to be proficient in the work, without prejudice to any rights the employer has against the defaulting service provider. The Employer will give written notice to the service provider of such instances where he/she appoints another Service Provider to remedy defects in the Works.

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
