GCC

#### NOTES

The number of this document is to:

- (i) Draw special attention to certain general conditions applicable to government trok, contracts and orders; and
- iii) To ensure that allents be familier with regard to the rights and obligations of all parties involved in doing business with government.

in this document words in the singular also mean in the gloral and yice verss and words in the masculine also mean in the fermining and nexter.

- Tige General Convisions of Contract will form part of all bid/quotation documents and may not be amended.
- Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) relevant to a specific and, should be compiled separately for every bid (if applicable) and will supplement the General Conditions of Contract. Whenever there is a conflict, the provisions in the SCC shall prevail.

#### 1 Definitions

The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:

- 1.1. "Closing time" means the date and how specified in the todding documents for the receipt of bids,
- 15.2. "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- 1.3. \*Contract price\* means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
- 1.4. "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or scholling of any thing of value to influence like action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
- 1.5. "Countervailing duties" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and excouraged to market its products internationally.
- 1.6. "Dountry of origin" means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a compercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.
- 1.7. "Day" means calendar day,
- 4.8. "Delivery" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.
- 1.9. "Desvery ex stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand.
- 1.10. Delivery into consignous store or to his site" means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier boaring all risks and disasteed involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.
- 1.31. "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise exceed market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of begin and which have the potential to harm the loost industries in the RSA.
- 1.12. "Force majoure" means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not knowlving the supplier's fault or negligence and not forcesceable. Such events away include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchasor in its sovereign expectly, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and fraight embargoes.
- 1.13. "Fraudulent practice" means a pastepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to a later to submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the tidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- 1.14. "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract.
- 1.15. "Guides" means all of the equipment, machinary, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the switchaser under the contract.
- 1.16. "Imported content" means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or its subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs auch as landing costs, dock does, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and hardenges to the factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.
- 1.17. "Local content" means that portion of the bidding price which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.
- 1.18. "Manufacture" means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities.
- \$,19. "Order" means: an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service.
- 1.20. Project site, where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents.
- 1.21. "Purchaser" means the organization purchasing the goods,
- 1.22. "Republic" means the Republic of South Africa.
- 1,23, "SCC" meass the Special Conditions of Contract.
- 1.24. "Gervices" means those functional services ancillary to the supply of the goods, auch as transportation and only other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, mexitenance and other such obligations of the supplier covered to see the contract.
- 1.25. "Written" or "in writing" means handwritten in ink or any form of electronic or mechanical writing.

## 2 Application

- 2.1. These general conditions are applicable to all bids, confineds and orders including bids for functions and professional services, sales, hising, letting and the granting or populating of pights, but excluding immovable proporty, unless otherwise excluded in the bidding documents.
- 2.2. Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific supplies, services or works.
- 2.3. Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply.

## 3 General

- 3.4. Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall sot be liable for any expanse incurred in the preparation and submission of a bid. Where applicable a non-vetundable tee for documents may be charged.
- 3.2. With certain exceptaxes, Invitations to bid are only published in the Government Tender Bulletin. The Government Tender Bulletin may be obtained directly from the Government Printer. Private Bog X85, Prena DDD1, or accessed electronically from www.fredsury.gov.ze



## 4 Standards

4.1. The goods supplied shall conform to the standards exentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.

## 5 Use of contract documents and Information; inspection.

- 5.1. The supplier shall not, without the purchasor's poor written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, eample, or information furnished by or on becast of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.
- 5.2. The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information intentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for purposes of performing the contract.
- 5.3. Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in QCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the gordhaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.
- 5.4. The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.

#### 6 Patent rights

6.1. The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part these to by the purchaser.

#### 7 Performance security

- 7.1. Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful hidder shall formish to the purchaser the performance security of the amount shedded in SCC.
- 7.2. The proceeds of the performance security should be payable to the purchasor as compensation for any loss resulting from the suppliers failure to complete his oblinations under the contract.
- 7.3. The performance security shall be denominated in the quiversty of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall be in one of the following force:
  - (a) a bonk guarantee or an irrevocable bittor of credit issued by a regulable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the
    purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser; or
  - (b) a cashier's or certified cheque
- 7.4. The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and rotorroot to the supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the supplier's performance obtogetions under the comment, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

#### 8 inspections, tests and analyses

- 8.1. All are-bidding testing will be for the account of the bidder.
- 8.2. If all siabid condition that supplies to be produced or services to be randored should all any stage during production or execution or on completion be subject to inspection. The premises of the bidder or contractor show the open, at all reasonable hours, for trispection by a representative of the Department or an organization acting on behalf of the Department.
- 8.3. If there are no inspection requirements indicated in the bidding documents and so mention is made in the contract, but during the contract period of a decided that inspections shall be carried out, the purchaser shall itself make the necessary orrangements, indexing payment arrangements with the testing authority concerned.
- 8.4. If the inspections, tests and analyses referred to in clauses 6.2 and 8.3 show the supplies to be in accordance with the contract requirements, the cost of the inspections, tests and analyses shall be defrayed by the purchasor.
- 6.5. Where the supplies or services referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 do not comply with the contract requirements, treespective of whether such supplies or services are accepted or not, the cost in connection with these respections, tests or analyses shall be detrayed by the supplier.
- 8.8. Supplies and services which are referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 and which do not comply with the contract requirements may be rejected,
- 8.7. Any contract supplies may on or effer delivery be inspected, tested or analyzed and may be rejected if found not to comply with the requirements of the contract. Such rejected supplies shall be held at the cost and risk of the supplier who shall, when called upon, remove them immediately at his own cost and forthwith substitute them with supplies which do comply with the requirements of the contract. Failing such removal the rejected supplies shall be returned at the suppliers cost and risk. Should the supplier fast to provide the substitute supplies forthwith, the purchaser may, without giving the supplier further opportunity in substitute the rejected supplies, purchase such supplies as may be necessary at the expense of the supplier.
- 8.8. The provisions of clauses 8.4 to 8.7 shall not projudice the right of the purchaser to cancel the contract on account of a breach of the conditions thereof, or to act in terms of Clause 23 of GCC.

## 9 Packing

- 9.3. The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough hencing transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, selt and predictation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the obsence of heavy bandling facilities at all points in transit.
- 9.2. The packing, marking, and continentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, diany, specified in SCC, and in any subsequent instructions ordered by the parchaser.

## 10 Delivery and documents

The supplier forther warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, matcrials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material a required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any action onsission of the supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions provading in the country of final destination.
- This warranty shall remain will for twelve (12) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (16) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified atherwise in SCC.
- The purchaser shall promptly extity the supplier in writing of any classes arising under this warranty. 15.3.
- Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified in SCC and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or 15.4. parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser.
- If the supplier, baving been noblied, fells to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified in SCC, the purchasor may proceed to take such remedial action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without projudice to any other rights which the purchasor may have against the supplier under the contract.

#### 16 Payment

- The method and conditions of payment to be made to the supplier under this contract shall be specified in SCC-16.1.

#### Delays in the supplier's performance 21

- Delivery of the goods and performance of services shalf be made by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the purchaser in the 21.1.
- If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding usingly delivery of the goods 21.2 and performance of services, the supplier shall promotly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the supplier's notice, like purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may at his discretion extend the supplier's time for performance, with or without the imposition of panalties, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.
- No provision in a context shall be deemed to prohibit the obtaining of supplies or services from a national department, provincial department, or a local 21.3. authority.
- The right is reserved to produce dutside of the contract small quantities on to have minor essential services executed if an emergency arises, the 23.4. supplier's point of supply is not situated at or near the place where the supplier are required, or the supplier's services are not readly available.



- 21.5. Except as provided under GCC Clause 25, a delay by the supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render the supplier fields to the imposition of penalties, pursuant to GCC Clause 22, unless on extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2 without the application of penalties.
- 21.6. Upon any dotay beyond the delivery period to the case of a supplies contract, the purchaser shall, without canceling the contract, be entitled to purchase supplies of a similar quality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods delivered taler at the supplier's expense and risk, or to cancel the contract and buy study goods as may be required to complete the contract and without pregradue to his other rights, be entitled to claim demages from the supplier.

#### 22 Penalties

22.1. Subject to GCC Clabse 25, if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the services within the period(s) specified is the contract, like purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed goods or unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance. The purchaser may also consider termination of the contract pursuant to GCC Clause 25.

#### 23 Termination for default

- 23.1. The purchaser, without projudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, may terminate like contract. So whole or in cert.
  - if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods will be like period(s) specified in the contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the purchasor persuent to GCC Clause 21.2;
  - (b) if the Supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract, or
  - (c) if the supplier, in the judgment of the purchaser, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in companing for or in executing the contract.
- 28.2. In the event the purchaser terminates the contract to whole or in part, the purchasor may produce, upon such terms and in such manner as if deems appropriete, goods, works or services similar to those podelivered, and the supplier shall be liable to the purchaser for any excess costs for such similar goods, works or services. However, the supplier shall continue performance of the contract to the extent not terminated.
- 23.3. Where the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may decide to unpose a vestriction ponalty on the supplier by prohibiting such supplier from doing business with the public sector for a period not exceeding 10 years.
- 23.4. If a purchaser intends imposing a rostriction on a supplier or any person associated with the supplier, the supplier will be allowed a time period of not since than fourteen (14) days to provide reasons why the envisaged rostriction should not be imposed. Should the supplier foil to respond within the stipulated toodeen (14) days the purchaser may regard the intended penalty as not objected against and may impose it on the supplier.
- 23.5. Any restriction imposed on any person by the Accounting Officer / Authority wiß, at the discretion of the Accounting Officer / Authority, also be applicable to any other enterprise or any partner, manager, director in other person who wholly or partly exercises or exercised or may exercise control over the enterprise of the first-mentioned person, and with which enterprise or person the first-mentioned person, is or was in the opinion of the Accounting Officer / Authority actively associated.
- 28.6. If a restriction is imposed, the purchaser must, within five (5) working days of such imposition, furnish the National Treasury, with the following information:

  - (iv) the reasons for the restriction.

When, after the date of bid, provisional payments are required, or antidumping or countervailing dubes are imposed, or the amount of a provisional payment or anti-dumping or countervailing right is increased in respect of any dumped or subsidized import, the State is not liable for any amount as required or imposed, or for the amount of any such increase. When, after the second date, such a provisional payment is no longer required or any such antidumping or countervailing right is abolished, or where the amount of such provisional payment or any such right is reduced, any such favourable difference shall on demand be pold forthwith by the contractor to the State or the State may deduct such amounts from moneys (if any) which may otherwise the due to the contractor in regard to supplies or services which he delivered or rendered or as to deliver or randor in terms of the contract or any other contract or any other amount weighness be due to him.

## Force Maleure

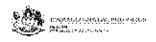

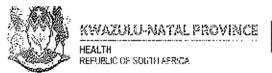
