GCC

#### NOTES

The purpose of this document is to:

- Draw special attention to certain general conditions applicable to government bids, contracts and orders, and (0) (ii)
- to ensure that clients to familiar with regard to the rights and obligations of all parties involved in doing business with government.

In this document words in the singular also mean in the plural and vice versa and words in the masculing also mean in the feminine and neutor.

- The General Conditions of Contract will form part of all bid/quotation documents and may not be amended.
- Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) relevant to a specific bid, should be compiled separately for every bid (if applicable) and will supplement the General Conditions of Contract. Whenever there is a conflict, the provisions in the SCC shall prevail.

### 1

The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:

- 1.1, "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
- "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein. 1.3
- "Contract price" means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations. 1.4.
- "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
- Countervailing duties are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products 1.5.
- "Country of origin" means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced 1.6. when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components, 1.7.
- "Day" means calendar day.
- 1.8. "Delivery" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.
- 1.9. "Delivery ex stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand. 1.10.
- "Delivery into consignoes store or to his site" means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or deput or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier bearing all risks and charges involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.
- 1.11. \*Dumping\* occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the potential to harm the local industries in the RSA

- 1.13, "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any hidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices al artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition,
- 1.14 "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract,
- 1.15. "Goods" means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract. 1.16.

- "Written" or "in writing" means handwritten in link or any form of electronic or mechanical writing.

- The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications. 41
- Use of contract documents and information; inspection.
- 5.1. The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be
- The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for 5.3
- Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the puchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.

## Performance security

- The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall

## Inspections, tests and analyses

- (i) Advance notification to the purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the purchaser to procure needed requirements; and
- (ii) following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the purchaser, the blueprints, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested.

15 Warranty

The supplier warrants that the goods supplied under the contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and majorials unless provided otherwise in the contract. The supplier further warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any actor omission of the supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the
- 15.2 This warranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise in SCC.
- The purchaser shall promptly rollify the supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty.
- Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified in SCC and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or
- If the supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified in SCC, the purchaser may proceed to take such remedial 15.5 action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the purchaser may have against the

16 Payment

- The method and conditions of payment to be made to the supplier under this contract shall be specified in SCC. 16.1.
- The supplier shall furnish the purchaser with an invoice accompanied by a copy of the delivery note and upon fulfillment of other obligations stipulated in
- Payments shall be made promptly by the purchaser, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of an invoice or claim by the supplier. 16.4. Payment will be made in Rand unless otherwise stipulated in SCC.

17 Prices

Prices charged by the supplier for goods delivered and services performed under the contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the supplier in his 17.1. bid, with the exception of any price adjustments authorized in SCC or in the purchasor's request for bid validity extension, as the case may be.

20 Subcontracts

20.1. The supplier shall notify the purchaser in writing of all subcontracts awarded under this contracts if not stready specified in the bid. Such notification, in the original bid or lator, shall not relieve the supplier from any liability or obligation under the contract.

Delays in the supplier's performance 21

- Delivery of the goods and performance of services shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the purchaser in the 21.1.

If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding limely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). ## Termination for default

- 23.1. The purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, may terminate this contract
  - (a) if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods within the period(s) specified in the contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the purchase pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2;
  - (b) if the Supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract, or
- (c) if the supplier, in the judgment of the purchaser, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the contract. In the event fie purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, goods, works or services similar to those undefluered, and the supplier shall be liable to the purchaser for any excess costs for such similar
- goods, works or services. However, the supplier shall continue performance of the contract to the extent not terminated. Where the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may decide to impose a restriction penalty on the supplier by prohibiting 23.3 such supplier from doing business with the public sector for a period not exceeding 10 years.



- 1.5. The local content (LC) expressed as a percentage of the bid price must be calculated in accordance with the SABS approved technical specification number SATS 1286: 2011 as follows:
