GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

NOTES

The purpose of this document is to:

- Draw special attention to certain general conditions applicable to government bids, contracts and orders, and
- To ensure that elients be familiar with regard to the rights and eleigntons of all parties involved in doing business with government. (1)

in this document words in the singular also mean in the plural and vice versa and words in the macculine also mean in the feminine and neuter.

- The General Conditions of Contract will form part of all bid/quotation documents and may not be amended.
- Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) relevant to a specific bid, should be compiled separately for every bid (if applicable) and will supplement the General Conditions of Contract. Whonever there is a conflict, the provisions in the SCC shall prevail.

The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:

- "Closing time" means the date and hour spectand in the bidging documents for the receipt of bids.
- 1.2. "Contract" means the written agreethent entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties. including all affectiments and appearations thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- "Contract price" means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations. 1.3
- 1.4. "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving receiving, or collisiting of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
- 1,5. 'Countervalling duties" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally.
- 1.5. "Country of prigin" means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose of utility from its components,
- 1.7. "Day" means calendar day.
- 1.8. "Delivery" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.
- 1,9. "Delivery ex stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand.
- 1.10. "Delivery into consignees store of to his site" means getivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the consistions of the contract or order, the supplier beating all risks and charges involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.
- 1.11. "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the gotential to harm the local industries in the RSA
- "Force majeure" means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not Involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foresceable. Such events 1.12. may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.
- 1.13, "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- 1.14 "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract.
- 1,15. "Goods" means all of the equipment machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract.
- 1.18. "Imported content" means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty of other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.
- 1.17. "Local content" means that portion of the bidding price which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.
- 1.18. "Manufacture" means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding
- 1.19. "Order" means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service.
- 1.20. "Project sits," where applicable, means the place indicated in hidding documents.
- 1,21. "Purchaser" means the organization purchasing the goods.
- "Republic" means the Republic of South Africa.
- "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract.
- "Gery cas" means those functional services ancillary to the supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as 1.24. installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, celering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the supplier covered under the confiect.
- 1.25. "Written" or "in writing" means handwriten in link or any form of electronic or mechanical writing.

- 2.1. These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services, sales, hiring, letting and the granting of acquiring of rights, but excluding immovable property, unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents. Where applicable, apacial conditions of centract are also failed down to cover specific supplies, services or works.

- 2.3. Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply.

3 General

- 3.1. Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a bid. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged.
- 3.2. With parish, exceptions, invitations to bid are only published in the Government Tender Bulletin. The Government Tender Bulletin may be obtained directly from the Government Printer, Private Bag X8s, Pretona 0001, or accessed electronically from www.treasury.gov.za



Standards

- 4.1. The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.
- 5 Use of contract documents and information; inspection,
- 5.1. The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, purtern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.
- 5.2. The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for purposes of performing the contract.
- 4.3. Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.
- 5.4. The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.

6 Patent rights

6.1. The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of intringsment of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.

7 Performance security 7.1. Within thirty (30) days o

- 7.1. Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security of the amount specified in BCC.
- 7.2. The proceeds of the performance security shall be psyable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete his obligations under the centract.
- 7.3. The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall be in one of the following forms:

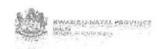
