GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

NOTES

The purpose of this document is to:

- Draw special attention to certain general conditions applicable to government bids, contracts and orders; and
- To ensure that clients be familiar with regard to the rights and obligations of all parties involved in doing business with government. (i) (ii)

In this document words in the singular also mean in the plural and vice versa and words in the masculine also mean in the feminine and neuter.

- The General Conditions of Contract will form part of all bid/quotation documents and may not be amended.
- Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) relevant to a specific bid, should be compiled separately for every bid (if applicable) and will supplement the General Conditions of Contract. Whenever there is a conflict, the provisions in the SCC shall prevail.

Definitions 1

The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:

- "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
- "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, 1.1. 1.2. including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- "Contract price" means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations. 1.3.
- "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement 1.4. process or in contract execution.
- "Countervailing duties" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products 1.5. internationally.
- "Country of origin" means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is 1.6. substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.
- "Day" means calendar day. 1.7.
- "Delivery" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order. 1.8.
- "Delivery ex stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand. 1.9.
- "Delivery into consignees store or to his site" means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier bearing all risks and charges involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained. 1.10.
- "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and 1.11. which have the potential to harm the local industries in the RSA
- "Force majeure" means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foreseeable. Such events may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions 1.12.
- "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive 1.13. levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract. 1.14.
- "Goods" means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract. 1.15.
- "Imported content" means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs 1.16. such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.
- "Local content" means that portion of the bidding price which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place. 1.17.
- "Manufacture" means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding 1.18.
- "Order" means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service. 1 19.
- "Project site," where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents. 1.20.
- "Purchaser" means the organization purchasing the goods. 1.21.
- "Republic" means the Republic of South Africa. 1.22.
- "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract. 1.23.
- "Services" means those functional services ancillary to the supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the 1.24. supplier covered under the contract.
- "Written" or "in writing" means handwritten in ink or any form of electronic or mechanical writing. 1.25.

Application 2

- These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services, sales, hiring, letting and the granting or acquiring of rights, but excluding immovable property, unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents. 21.
- Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific supplies, services or works. 2.2.
- Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply. 2.3.

- Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a 3 1. bid. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged.
- With certain exceptions, invitations to bid are only published in the Government Tender Bulletin. The Government Tender Bulletin may be obtained directly from the Government Printer, Private Bag X85, Pretoria 0001, or accessed electronically from www.treasury.gov.za 3.2.



- The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.
- Use of contract documents and information; inspection. 5
- The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the 5.1. supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.
- The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for 5.2. purposes of performing the contract.
- the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser. 5.3.
- The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors 5.4. appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.

The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use 6.1. of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.

- Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security of the 7.1.
- The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete 7.2. his obligations under the contract.
- The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall 7.3.
 - (a) a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser; or
- The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and returned to the supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the supplier's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise specified in SCC. 7.4.

Inspections, tests and analyses 8

- All pre-bidding testing will be for the account of the bidder. 8.1.
- If it is a bid condition that supplies to be produced or services to be rendered should at any stage during production or execution or on completion be subject to inspection, the premises of the bidder or contractor shall be open, at all reasonable hours, for inspection by a representative of the Department 8.2. or an organization acting on behalf of the Department.
- If there are no inspection requirements indicated in the bidding documents and no mention is made in the contract, but during the contract period it is decided that inspections shall be carried out, the purchaser shall itself make the necessary arrangements, including payment arrangements with the 8.3.
- If the inspections, tests and analyses referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 show the supplies to be in accordance with the contract requirements, the cost of 8.4. the inspections, tests and analyses shall be defrayed by the purchaser.

- Supplies and services which are referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 and which do not comply with the contract requirements may be rejected.
- Any contract supplies may on or after delivery be inspected, tested or analyzed and may be rejected if found not to comply with the requirements of the 8.6. contract. Such rejected supplies shall be held at the cost and risk of the supplier who shall, when called upon, remove them immediately at his own cost 8.7. and forthwith substitute them with supplies which do comply with the requirements of the contract. Failing such removal the rejected supplies shall be returned at the suppliers cost and risk. Should the supplier fail to provide the substitute supplies forthwith, the purchaser may, without giving the supplier further opportunity to substitute the rejected supplies, purchase such supplies as may be necessary at the expense of the supplier.
- The provisions of clauses 8.4 to 8.7 shall not prejudice the right of the purchaser to cancel the contract on account of a breach of the conditions thereof, 8.8. or to act in terms of Clause 23 of GCC.

- The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme 9.1. temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.
- The packing, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, if any, specified in SCC, and in any subsequent instructions ordered by the purchaser. 9.2.

The goods supplied under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or 11.1. acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery in the manner specified in the SCC.

As specified in SCC, the supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following materials, notifications, and information pertaining to spare parts manufactured or distributed by the supplier:

- such spare parts as the purchaser may elect to purchase from the supplier, provided that this election shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under the contract; and
- (b) in the event of termination of production of the spare parts:
 - (i) Advance notification to the purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the purchaser to procure needed requirements; and
 - (ii) following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the purchaser, the blueprints, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested.

- The supplier warrants that the goods supplied under the contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract. The supplier further warrants that all goods supplied under this 15.1. contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any act or emission of the supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the
- This warranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source 15.2. country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise in SCC.
- The purchaser shall promptly notify the supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty. 15.3.
- Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified in SCC and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser.
- If the supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified in SCC, the purchaser may proceed to take such remedial action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the purchaser may have against the 15.5. supplier under the contract.

- The method and conditions of payment to be made to the supplier under this contract shall be specified in SCC. 16.1.
- The supplier shall furnish the purchaser with an invoice accompanied by a copy of the delivery note and upon fulfillment of other obligations stipulated in 16.2.
- Payments shall be made promptly by the purchaser, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of an invoice or claim by the supplier. 16.3.
- Payment will be made in Rand unless otherwise stipulated in SCC. 16.4.

- Prices charged by the supplier for goods delivered and services performed under the contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the supplier in his bid, with the exception of any price adjustments authorized in SCC or in the purchaser's request for bid validity extension, as the case may be 17.1.

- No variation in or modification of the terms of the contract shall be made except by written amendment signed by the parties concerned. 18.1.

- The supplier shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform under the contract, except with the purchaser's prior written consent. 19.1.

- The supplier shall notify the purchaser in writing of all subcontracts awarded under this contracts if not already specified in the bid. Such notification, in 20.1. the original bid or later, shall not relieve the supplier from any liability or obligation under the contract.
- Delivery of the goods and performance of services shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the purchaser in the 21 21.1.
- If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon 21.2. as practicable after receipt of the supplier's notice, the purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may at his discretion extend the supplier's time for performance, with or without the imposition of penalties, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.

- Upon any delay beyond the delivery period in the case of a supplies contract, the purchaser shall, without canceling the contract, be entitled to purchase supplies of a similar quality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods 21.6. delivered later at the supplier's expense and risk, or to cancel the contract and buy such goods as may be required to complete the contract and without prejudice to his other rights, be entitled to claim damages from the supplier.

- In the event the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, goods, works or services similar to those undelivered, and the supplier shall be liable to the purchaser for any excess costs for such similar 23.2. goods, works or services. However, the supplier shall continue performance of the contract to the extent not terminated.
- Where the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may decide to impose a restriction penalty on the supplier by prohibiting 23.3. such supplier from doing business with the public sector for a period not exceeding 10 years.

Anti-dumping and countervailing duties and rights

- Complaints lodged two (2) or more days after the award will not be entertained.
- Complaints must be directed to the Responsibility Manager of the institution (Hospital or CHC) and District Finance Manager for District Offices.
- It must be noted that this is not an appeals process and as such will not half the procurement process.

2. Institution prepares written response to complaint

- The Responsibility Manager, or his appointee, must prepare a response letter to the complainant.
- The complaint must be resolved within 60 days.
- Should the complainant not be satisfied with the response, the matter will be referred to the District Finance Manager (applicable to all Hospitals and CHC') or District Manager (Applicable to all District Offices) for a final verdict.
- Should the complainant still not be satisfied with the response received, they may then seek legal recourse at their own expense.

3. DIESEL FILLING AND INVOICE PROCESS

- 3.1 Supplier to arrange with the Maintenance Manager to be on site for the overseeing of the first diesel offloading to ensure orientation of the supplier and clinic facility's staff on the filing process and particulars of generator
- 3.2 For the second filling onwards, the Operational Manager of the facility or a nominated official to be in attendance during the diesel filling process. A Fuel Drop Off register will be completed and signed by both the Operational Manager (or delegate) and the contractor at the offloading site. The register will be retained by the Operational Manager on behalf of the Facility.
 - The contractor to also sign the Security Register on entry and departure from the Clinic. A security officer will be present when the offload occurs.

- 3.4 Invoices can be created at each drop off point and will be stamped by clinic and signed by Operational Manager on the day of fuel delivery. It will then be submitted to the Maintenance Manager for checking and further signature. The invoice will then be forwarded from Maintenance Section to Supply Chain Section/Stores.
- 3.5 Individual invoices to be submitted for each clinic.

5. PRICE ESCALATION

6. TERMINATION FOR DEFAULT.

- 6.1. The purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, may terminate this contract in whole in part:
 - I. If the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods within the period(s) specified in the contract.
 - II. If the supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract; or.
 - III. If the supplier, in the judgment of the purchaser, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing, the contract.
- 6.2. In the event of purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, goods, works or services similar goods, works or services.
- 6.3. Where the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may decide to impose a restriction penalty on the supplier by prohibiting such supplier from doing business with the public sector for period not exceeding 10 years
