

GCC

NOTES

The purpose of this document is to:

- (i) Draw special attention to certain general conditions applicable to government olds, contracts and orders; and
- (ii) To onsure that clients be tarester with regard to the rights and obligations of all parties involved in doing business with government.

In this document words is the singular also mean in the plural and vice versa and words in the masculine also mean in the feminino and soulds.

- The General Conditions of Contract will form part of all bid/quotation documents and may not be amended.
- Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) relevant to a specific bid, should be compiled separately for every bid (if applicable) and will supplement the General Conditions of Contract. Whenever there is a conflict, the provisions in the SCC shall provail.

Definitions

The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:


- 1.1. "Opening time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
- 1.2 "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attackments and appendices there and all rincuments second by reference therein.
- 3.3. *Contract price* means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual ubligations.
- 1.4. "Copyrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or solvating of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or its contract execution.

- 1.13. "Procedulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procedurers process or like execution of a contract to the delibrative any bidder, and includes collected among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- 1.14. "GCC" means the Control Conditions of Control.

- 2.3. Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply.

General

- 3.1. Unless otherwise theticated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and automission of a bid. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged.

4. Standards

4.1. The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the birtriing documents and specifications.

Use of confract documents and information; inspection.

- 5.1. The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the confrect, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewillb, in any person office than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure in any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be recessary for purposes of such performance.
- 5.2. The supplier shall not, without the parchasor's poor written consent, make use of any document or information mondoned in GCC clause 5.1 except for corposes of performing the contract.
- 5.3. Any document, other than the contract (set/ pertinent in GCC clause 5.3 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.
- 5.4. The supplier shall permit the purchases to inspect the supplier's records rotating to the performance of the supplier and to have them sudited by readilors appointed by the purchaser.

6. Patent rights

6.1. The supplier shall instructly the perchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patents, backerrark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchasor.

Performance security

- 7.1. Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the publication of contact award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security of the amount specified in SCC.

9. Peckfng

- 9.1. The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterteration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without timination, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, selt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the resolutions of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.
- 9.2. Except as provided under GCC Clause 25, a delay by the supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall readed the supplier fashe to the imposition of genelities, persuant to GCC Clause 21, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2 without the application of penalties.
- 21.6. Upon any delay beyond the delivery period in the case of a supplies contract, the purchaser shall, without canceling the contract, be entitled to purchase supplies of a similar quality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods delivered later at the supplier's expense and risk, or to cascal the contract and buy such goods as may be required to complete the contract and without prejurice to his other agents, be entitled to claim damages from the supplier.

22. Penalties

22.1. Subject to GCC Clause 25, if the subject falls to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the services will in the period(s) specified in the contract, the perchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remotics under the contract, descud from the contract price, as a ponalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed goods or unperformed services using the cerrent prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance. When a person's name has been endoused on the Register, the person will be prohibited from doing business with the public sector for a period not less than five years and not more than 19 years. The National Treasury is empowered to determine the period of restriction and each case with the dealt with on its own media. According to section 32 of the Act the Register must be open to the public. The Register can be perused on the National Treasury website.

Anti-dumping and countervalling duties and rights

24.3. 
