"Its in your hands- Prevent sepsis in health care"

St Aidan's regional hospital also responded to the WHO call on all health facilities to prevent health care-associated sepsis through hand hygiene and infection prevention and control (IPC) action. Sepsis is estimated to affect more than 30 million patients every year worldwide.

On the 04th of May 2018 all departments both clinical and non clinical presented their creative displays on prevention of sepsis, then the entire institution participated in a hand hygiene relay where Mrs. AN Magubane –IPC Coordinator emphasized about the importance of " hand hygiene, demonstrated hand washing and alcohol hand rub technique. She also stressed the importance of 5 moments of hand hygiene."

The IPC team then took out the hand hygiene drive to the nearest taxi rank at Inanda Taxi Rank where they educated the taxi rank users about the importance oh hand hygiene. They also educated them on how to wash hands and when to wash hands in order to prevent spread of infection in public. They all understood that effective hand hygiene plays a key role in a healthy lifestyle. The main focus for everyone on this day was on prevention of sepsis. 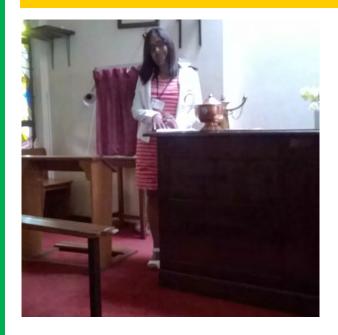
