This was in response to the call after His Majesty, Goodwill Zwelithini ka BhekuZulu announcing the need for a collaborated effort in fighting the spread of HIV in the province and to return the custom of passage for young men.

Within three weeks of the initial meeting with MATch NGO, St Aidan's Mission Regional Hospital
