Nursing Manager's Farewell

On 30 May 2018 the institution bid farewell to one of its senior managers: Mrs. Zondi (Nursing Manager). Mrs Zondi worked at the institution from 2012 as a Nursing Manager and had made some positive strides in patient care, service delivery and in her leadership role.

"You were leading the team as the head of the institution when there was no Chief Executive Officer (CEO); the management skills you possess; no one will take it away from you" said Miss. Ndlovu (CEO).

Miss Ndlovu, in her speech, also spoke of Mrs Zondi's capabilities; stating that she came at a time when there were elements of disarray and the institution was in dire need for a unifier and someone who would help to change the general mentality that prevailed at the time.

Mrs. Zondi was praised for her dedication to her work; and words by an unknown author were quoted:

"Sometimes people come into your life for a moment, a day or a lifetime. It matters not the time they spent with you but how they impacted your life in that time".

"Wherever I work: I always try to bring positive change"

The CEO said "You may depart from us physically, but you leave footprints for us to continue to walk on". She further thanked Mrs. Zondi for her significant input towards the management of the institution and the value of time she spent with staff. "We believe that you will continue to impact the lives of those you will meet as you continue in this joinery called life." said Miss Ndlovu

The Nursing Manager from Fort Napier Hospital (Mrs. T. Ngcobo), in her speech, attested to the qualities that the CEO mentioned about Mrs. Zondi; stating that she was an academic who always sought to share her knowledge with other people. Mrs. Ngcobo also mentioned that Mrs. Zondi was an assertive and vocal member of the uMgungundlovu Nursing Forum and that her qualities and attributes would be missed.

"I want to appreciate all that has been done for me today and over the years in this facility; but in my heart; I thank the Lord" said Mrs. Zondi. In her speech she likened herself to a caterpillar (motor grader) that is transported to a certain area and is used to build roads such that they are suitable for cars to be driven on them. Once the job is done, this machine, will always be moved to another area to "create" a road where there was none. "Wherever I work, I always try to bring positive change"

Mrs Zondi encouraged staff to continue to work hard. "Mental Health Care Users at this institution are very special; so God has qualified us to be good stewards where the care of these patients is concerned" said Mrs. Zondi. She thanked staff that supported her during difficulties when she lost her brother and mother. "My umbilical cord will always be at Umgeni Hospital, I am just a phone call away when I am needed".



