

# Hlabisa Hospital Triumphs With Eight Awards at ART/TB Closing the Gap Review

labisa Hospital and its clinics shone brightly at the 1.1 Million ART/TB Closing the Gap campaign review session held at Meet Mekaar on 27 November 2025, proudly walking away with eight top accolades.

The recognition highlighted the district's exceptional commitment to improving HIV and TB outcomes and strengthening quality healthcare delivery. The awards celebrated the collective effort of facility staff, management, and partners who have worked tirelessly to ensure that communities receive accessible, reliable, and patientcentred care. Their outstanding performance reflects consistent teamwork, strategic planning, and dedication to meeting national health targets.

One of the hospital's standout achievements was its remarkable progress in key HIV indicators. Currently, 97% of people in the catchment area know their HIV status, 81% have had their viral load monitored, and 90% have achieved viral suppression, a milestone that contributes significantly to the UNAIDS 95-95-95 goals. These results underscore the impact of robust testing initiatives, treatment support, and ongoing community outreach.

The eight accolades received serve not only as recognition but also as motivation for healthcare workers across Umkhanyakude health district. Hlabisa Hospital continues to demonstrate that with commitment, collaboration, and a shared vision for a healthier future, substantial progress in the fight against HIV and TB is possible.
