Strengthening GBV Response Through Multi-Sectoral Collaboration.



Committee of the KwaZulu-Natal Legislature, led by its Chairperson, Hon. Fikile Tshazi, conducted an oversight visit to the Jozini Thuthuzela Care Centre (TCC), located at Othobothini Community Health Centre. The visit formed part of the Committee's ongoing mandate to monitor the provision of essential services, as well as its participation in the national 16 Days of Activism for No Violence Against Women and Children campaign.

Thuthuzela Care Centres play a critical role in the fight against gender-based violence and sexual offences. These specialised, onestop facilities offer survivors a safe and supportive environment where they can access comprehensive assistance. Services available at the centres include immediate medical care, psychosocial support, counselling, and legal guidance, all provided within a coordinated and survivor-centred framework.

The Jozini TCC is supported by a dedicated multi-sectoral team comprising professionals from the National Prosecuting Authority (NPA), South African Police Service (SAPS), Department of Health, Department of Social Development, Department of Justice, and various partner organisations.

This integrated approach ensures that survivors receive timely, compassionate and well-coordinated care, while also strengthening efforts to combat GBV at community level. The Committee commended the staff and stakeholders for their commitment to protecting vulnerable groups and encouraged continued collaboration to improve service delivery and support for survivors.









Umkhanyakude Health District Leads 16 Days of Activism Drive in Jozini

nder the theme "Letsema: Men, Women, Boys and Girls Working Together to End Gender-Based Violence and Femicide (GBVF)", the Umkhanyakude Health District conducted a 16 Days of Activism activation at the Jozini Taxi Rank on 5th December 2025, joining national efforts to end violence against women and children.

The activation aimed to raise awareness about the realities of gender-based violence (GBV), promote community safety, and empower residents to report incidents of abuse. Health officials, stakeholders, and community members engaged in dialogue, educational outreach, and distribution of information materials to encourage reporting and ensure that survivors know where to access help.

According to district representatives, the outreach forms part of an ongoing commitment to foster safer communities, strengthen prevention efforts, and mobilise all sectors of society to work collectively against GBV and femicide.

Community members were urged to speak out, support survivors, and actively advocate for a society free from violence.

The district reaffirmed its dedication to ensuring that no one remains silent in the face of abuse.
