Mpaphala area is under ward four of uMlalazi Local Municipality, under Inkosi S. Ntuli of Mzungezi Tribal Authority. This is a long lived community dream that was manifested on the day. Local leaders and community at large were extremely excited by this project handover. The completion of construction for this clinic, will be a long lived legacy that will be enjoyed by the people of this community in so many years to come. This construction site is expected to boost the economy of the province, specifically of the area through job creation and business opportunities during different phases of construction. Building of this Clinic, is part of the department's health infrastructure development programme, as the country is preparing for the implementation of the National Health Insurance (NHI).

The NHI paves the way for citizens to achieve universal access to quality healthcare services, regardless of their socio-economic status, and to ensure that all South Africans have equitable access to affordable healthcare. One of the Department's core preventive care measure and mandate is that of engaging, informing and educating the public through Community Outreach Programmes on health matters.

Through **Isibhedlela Kubantu** (Healthcare services to the People) as one of our advocacy and community based health care service, the public received health services. The department ensure that vulnerable communities that are staying very far from our health institutions enjoy comprehensive health service, strategically focusing on HIV prevention and STIs.

This year's emphasis was on transformative change which is rooted in the Global Agenda which is based on the need for social work responding to community needs through all innovative community led approaches that are grounded in indigenous wisdom and harmonious coexistence with nature.

The partnership with University of Zululand made this day a Workers gathered together memorable one. The day was field with motivational talks, which were meant to mold and groom young students that are the future Social Workers and emphasis was also on reminding Social Workers to take care of themselves as the burden of work pressure can consume an individual which then can lead to a burn out. > Social Work is a practice-based profession and an academic discipline that promotes social change and development, social cohesion, and the empowerment and liberation of people. Principles of social justice, human rights, collective responsibility and respect for diversities are central to social work. Underpinned by theories of social work, social sciences, humanities and indigenous knowledge. Social work engages people and structures to address life challenges and enhance wellbeing.

A Social Worker's role in the health field is to enhance the person's social and emotional functioning through targeted interventions and the mobilization of services and support. Social Workers intervene in the context of a person's social environment and relationships, recognizing the impact of the socioeconomic, cultural, psychological and political determinants on health and overall wellbeing. In their commitment to human rights and social justice, social workers advocate for the rights of patients, against discrimination, reduced opportunities and abuse.

Social workers function within the parameters of a multidisciplinary team. They are best equipped to obtain the social history and composition of the family from the patient, and share this information with the members of the MDT. This is crucial in the health setting because certain illnesses cannot be treated effectively without taking into account the patient's social circumstances.

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Launching, Health Promoting Early Childhood Development Center

t was a very proudly moment when the first Early Childhood Development Centre was launched as a Health Promoting ECDC in the district. It is important to teach children good health behaviors whist still young. The partnership and hard work behind all process mapping of the project that a facility undergoes in order to achieve a status of being named a health promoting facility. The first step towards accreditation is a self status determination by the facility of which UMhlathuze crèche grabbed this opportunity with both hands, and that is where their journey began. This facility is looking after 226 children and it is imperative to ensure that basic health standards and hygiene and safety is maintained at all times.

There are five categories that a facility need to achieve in order to be regarded as compliant. Firstly, the facility needs to comply with development of personal skills, build healthy public policies, create a supportive, community action and reorient health services. An evidence during assessment that those policies are implanted and adhered to by all involved. The second phase of the journey towards accreditation is where by the facility is being assessed by the multidisciplinary district team to determine operational effectiveness indicated in the first phase and physical observations are done.

UMhlathuze Crèche is the first Early Childhood Development Centre in the district that has embarked on the journey until the end. This was really a proud moment for the center and the district. Mrs. S. Mngomezulu, the principal of the center was so happy and indicated her joy by thanking her team for the hard work and going beyond a call of duty in order to ensure that the targeted objective is indeed achieved. This achievement is not only going to benefit the center but the community as a whole. Parents will be assured that their children are in good hands under a safe and protective environment. This achievement by the center will also encourage other centers to follow.
