World Hand Hygiene Day



 $m{\mathscr{W}}$ entworth headed the global call made by the World

Health Organisation to all health care providers to raise awareness and instances of proper hand hygiene by holding the Hand Hygiene Day that took place on the 9th of May 2018.

The day was started by an energetic chant of the theme: "it's In Your Hands Prevent Sepsis In Healthcare" by members of staff from various departments, all with the common mission to criss-cross through different components of the institution and educate health care workers on the importance of proper hand hygiene.

Led by Infection Control Officer Matron G Mncwango, the task team made their way around the premises, starting in the Management offices where a Hand Hygiene Pledge was signed and the purpose of the day outlined. Every year, more than 30 million people worldwide are estimated to develop Sepsis and it remains a public health problem of global scope. Health care workers can prevent Sepsis by regularly washing their hands using the 7 step process and sanitisers.




