

There is a Covid-19 Task Team that meets twice a week to ensure that various protocols, Standard operation procedures and Infection control guidelines are in place. Wentworth Hospital Flu clinic was commissioned in April 2020. the Wentworth COVID 19 Task team partnered with the Divine Health Forum and raised funds to build a flu clinic on the unused Tennis court at Wentworth Hospital. The whole project took less than a month and a well -ventilated flu clinic was commissioned this year in June 2020. The flu clinic aimed to divert all patients with respiratory symptoms and a history of contact with a COVID 19 Case to the Flu clinic. Patient arriving at the gate are screened for COVID 19 and TB and if they are medically stable, they are directed to flu clinic, which is a short walking distance from the screening area. Screening begins every working day at 6 am with staff volunteering to man the screening area at the white marguee adjacent to the car park. The clinic opens from 07:00 to 16h00, Monday to Friday. The Supervisor is Sr Alexandra. Stable patients who are screened positive in the screening area are quickly triaged and if found unstable, they are resuscitated and transferred to emergency ward. Evaluation of COVID 19, TB and other communicable diseases are done and patients are seen by the Doctor or clinical nurse practitioner. Patients are educated on COVID 19,TB and Non communicable diseases. The clinic was assessed on the 20 August 2020 and obtained 80%. The clinic was assessed on compliance with the structure, screening systems, flow of patients, signage and complaints system..

Screening done to patiens for Covid –19

The Outreach Team led by Nurse Mr KK Maphumulo and together with the Covid –19 team responded swiftly on the complaint lodged by one of the community members who had a concern about people living in the informal settlement on the living conditions and health condition. The team went to asses the state of health in the informal settlement. Sir Ncube, Nurse Khanyile, Nurse Ngcobo, Nurse Maphumulo, assisted the ill gentleman with swollen feet to reconnect with his family. The team also discovered that that there were many patients coughing, and they were symptomatic of PTB and Covid –19. Health education was given to TB and Covid 19-precautions and safe hygiene practices.

- 35 patients screened for TB AND Covid-19
- 15 Patients were tested for TB
- 1 Patient was referred to hospital for Bilateral swollen feet
- 10 patients were discovered to be under weight and commenced on the Integrated Nutrition Program
