INTRODUCING..... FAMILY MEDICINE

Wentworth Hospital in its new identity as a District Hospital, has taken on Family Medicine as its academic department. Family Medicine is the medical discipline, recently recognised by the Health Professions Council of South Africa as a speciality that is based in the district and district hospital. Its focus is on the person and family in the context of the community. Family medicine is a generalist discipline unlike other medical disciplines, which focus on:



- Integration of the services in the district, hospital & community.
- Capacity building, particularly to doctors, in partnership with the medical school. The focus will be on skills in the consultation, evidence based medicine, management of chronic and common illnesses, surgical & procedural skills, audit and research, human development and therapeutics, amongst others.
- Quality improvement & audit: setting standards and developing guidelines for the common and important illnesses in the community, implementing these and monitoring the effect this has on the quality of the service. Presently we have embarked on an audit of the medical records for in-patients and outpatients.
- Research into the important issues in district health care and family medicine. A research agenda has been drawn up and includes issues like patient-centred care, lifestyle & risk management, HIV, the development and improvement of the District Health System, the person of the doctor and its effect on the patient, clinical topics in family medicine, etc.
- Development of an integrated wellness clinic. The Family Medicine Department wants to run a "Wellness Clinic" at Wentworth Hospital. This will focus on wellness, lifestyle and health, and holistic and systems approaches. Most of our patients have illnesses that result from lifestyle choices and are chronic in nature. Chronic illness is becoming the major burden of illness worldwide and the WHO has recognized the need to have a fresh approach to chronic illness. A focus on wellness has been on way of looking at this, and has been adopted in several places as an approach.

Values:

- Those of the KZN Department of Health.
- McWhinney's Principles of Family Medicine, which include: commitment to the person, continuity of care, teamwork, management of resources, sharing the habitat of the patient, working in the district as a whole.
- The notion that the family physician is part of the PHC team, working towards optimal patient, family & community health care.

Area of Operation:

- Base hospital.
- Catchment area of hospital.
- Districts outside of Durban.

Districts:

- Support & provide clinical leadership to the network of PHC services.
- Support clinical service delivery in the district as a whole, to achieve continuity of care.
- Drive the departmental audit on medical records & its follow-on programmes.
- Assist in developing a wellness centre in districts, linked to the HIV programmes.

Activities:

- Champion patient-centredness & develop the consultation skills of doctors to promote Batho Pele.
- Initiate & supervise research, in line with Department of Health, hospital, district & Department of Family Medicine priorities & research agendas.
- Focus particularly on community-based & participatory research methodology.
- Improve therapeutics through hospital, district & provincial pharmacy & therapeutics committees.
- Assist in planning & developing the HIV & TB care programmes.

Hospital:

- Support & facilitate the provision of the designated package of services & the referral pattern, to promote high quality care.
- Facilitate the provision of holistic, patient-centred care, within the catchment area.
- Establish a pioneer wellness clinic in district hospitals.
- Facilitate the development of EBM-based guidelines.
- Establish base hospitals as centres of excellence for training of family physicians & doctors for district-level services.
- Support & assist PHC-managers & hospital doctors in audit & quality improvement.
- Support of postgraduate & 6^{th} -year students in the districts.
- Develop family medicine training sites in rural districts.

The hospital has several recently qualified family physicians as well as other experienced generalists on its staff. The Nelson R Mandela School of Medicine has taken them on as honorary lecturers. With the community service doctors and other colleagues, we have the unique opportunity of shaping the hospital and district health care in our catchment area, as well as a long-term and on-going effect on service provision through the training and mentoring of students, benchmarking for other district hospitals and involvement in the DHS.

Wentworth Hospital has recently undertaken the process of establishing a psychology department. It began as one office located in Occupational Health Department and has now moved to new premises – formally the neuroscience laboratory. The department currently has two Psychologists – Alan Fourie (Clinical psychologist) and Cathy Giels (Community Service

The Psychology department is slowly emerging. The old neuroscience laboratory has undergone significant changes thanks to the efforts of workshop. There are now 3 single offices in which the psychologists conduct assessments and individual therapy. There is also a large room which is intended for group work when we are more established. One corner of this room is currently occupied by the Play Therapy Room, which is not as yet fully established. In order to conduct effective play therapy, the room needs to provide containment. We hope this will be achieved by finding bookcases to delineate the boundaries of the playroom section. These will also be used to hold the toys and art materials that are used by the child to express and play out his or her emotional conflicts.

The functions of the psychology department are to conduct diagnostic assessment of a multitude of mental disorders and to provide treatment in the form of individual or group therapy, play psychotherapy for children and family or martial therapy when indicated. The types of cases we see range from behaviour problems in children, suicide attempts, bereavement and trauma, to name just a few.
