Dr Rice Mokena's farewell function was held on the 17 May 2012 at the 15 floor

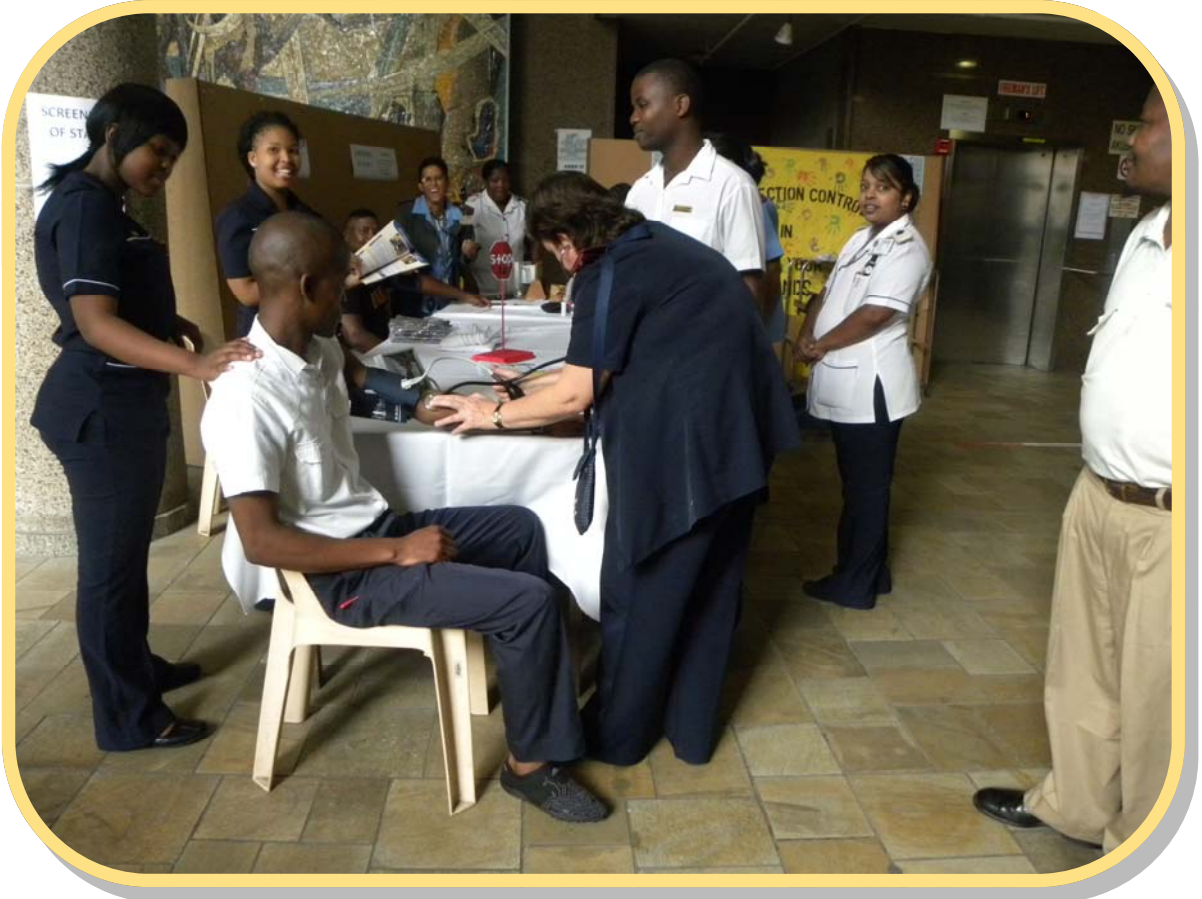
Boardroom. The Management and staff attended the farewell function.

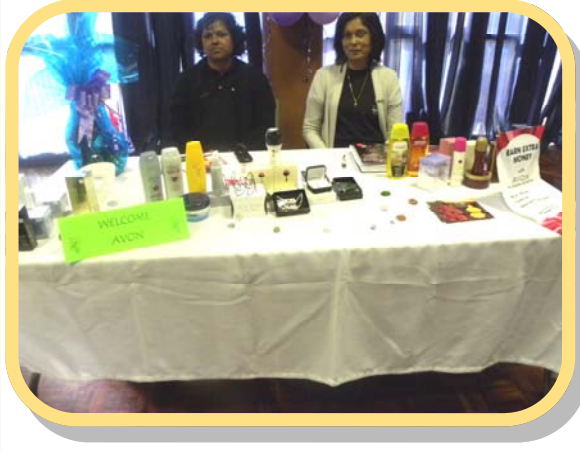


Addington Hospital celebrates the Nurses Day every year but each year the standard improves for the

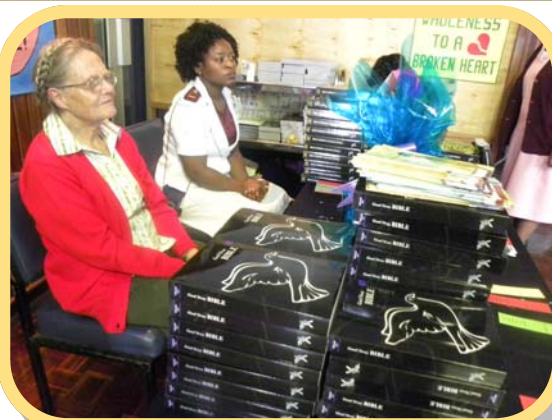

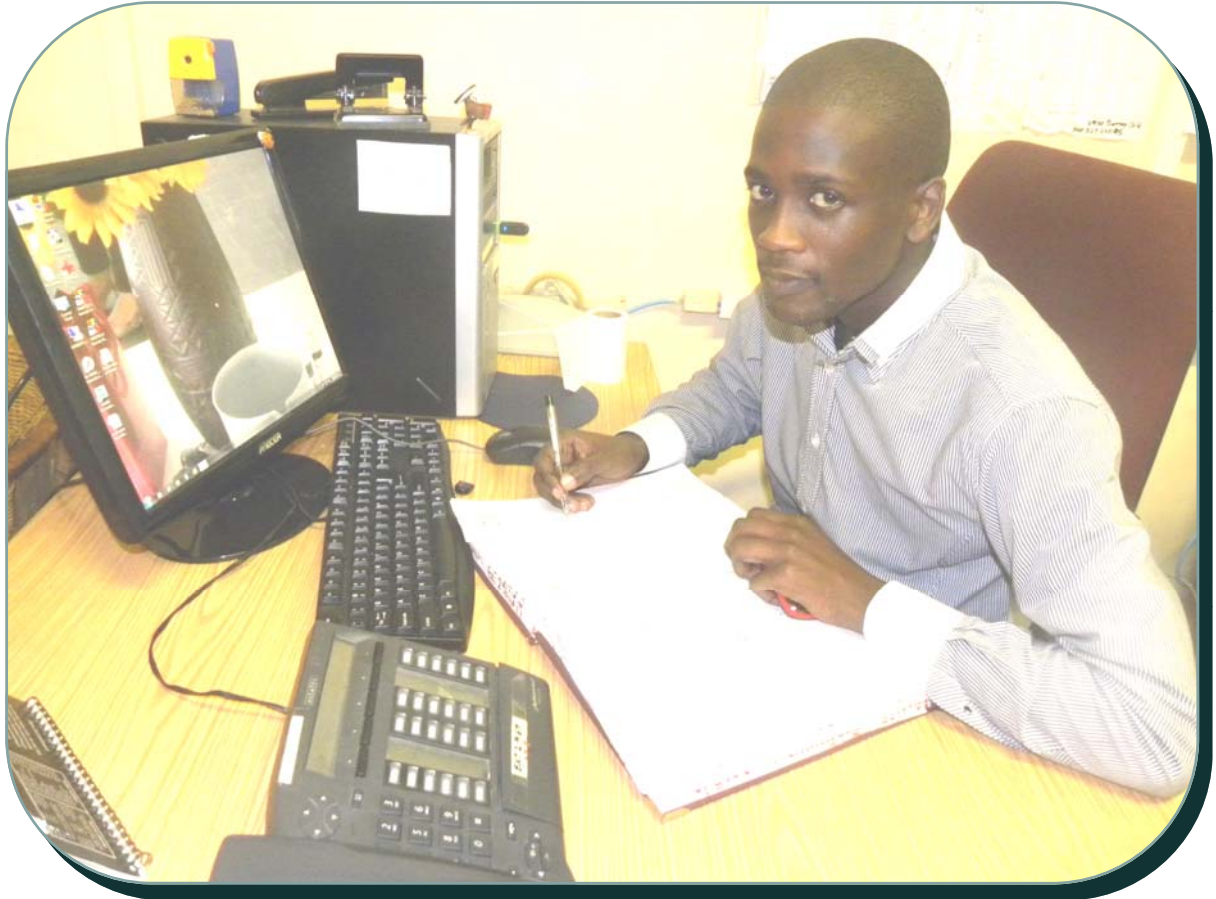
