MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS DAY

On the 5 December 2012, the Appelsbosch hospital hosted Mental Health Awareness Day. This was organized under the global 2012 theme "Mental Health in Primary Care: Enhancing Treatment and Promoting Mental Health". The events facilitated dialogue between members of the community and mental health practitioners who deal with mental health issues on daily basis. These include Doctors, Nurses, SAPS and Traditional Healers.

Due to the surrounding community having limited knowledge regarding mental health, the aim was to educate staff, nurses and the community on the aetiologies, causes,



assessment and treatment of mental health. It was valuable information to improve on their awareness of mental health, and thus reduce the impact of stereotypes regarding people with mental health in rural community. The referral process from primary health care clinics to mental health services was also addressed. It was discussed that mental health problems are very common in societies throughout the world. People with mental health problems need to be cared for and are general not dangerous. Here are some types of mental condition:

SCHIZOPHTENIA

The thinking of a person suffering from schizophrenia is disrupted. It is often includes experiences such as hearing voices or holding fixed abnormal beliefs. Treatment should usually be medication and a (psycho-social) programme

EPILEPSY

This is a brain disease where people usually seizures (fits) the fits can range from being very short and not occurring often to being severe and happen regularly. Medication is the best treatment.

DEPRESSION

A person with depression feels very low and down. They lose interest in things and feel very little pleasure. In some cases this mood is suddenly swooped with very high or manic feelings and behavior. Treatment is usually psychological intervention (counseling) or both medication.
