CATHERINE BOOTH HOSPITAL ISIBHEDLELA KU-BANTU

As part of PHC re-engineering programmes, the Catherine Booth Hospital provided outreach services in a form of Isibhedlela kubantu at a youth day celebration event that was held at the Holy Tower Assembly Church—Ezingwenya Ward 18 on the 16th June 2023. Amongst the multidisciplinary team that was providing services were two medical doctors, a Physiotherapist, Social Worker, a Lay Counsellor and different categories of nurses.

This area is dominated by youth and there is an accumulative number of teenagers getting pregnant, catching STIs, defaulting on medication, and an increased number of chronic patients, and lack of knowledge regarding health issues. A number of healthcare services were offered during this event to ensure that this community is assisted on the issues they are facing. Services that were offered included HIV Testing Services, STI management, PreP, social welfare services, family planning, children immunisation, physiotherapy, minor ailments and many more.

Addressing the congregation, Mr. S.C Thusi—Public Relations Officer pronounced that one of the CBH's 2023/27 strategic goals is strengthening of the outreach services. This meant that the service delivery programs will be based on Primary Health Care approach and more focus will be to maximize prevention and promotion of health by investing in the Community Based Model through the outreach activities.

The establishment of a second mobile team was already on the pipeline as more staff was employed and the confirmation of new points in the community was already in the final stages which was going to result in the facility have a total number of 40 mobile points of which most of them being at ward 6. The support of 3 fixed subsidiary clinics, namely, Mvutshini, Ensingweni and Gingindlovu Clinic was also amongst the facility priorities for the next 5 years.









ISIBHEDLELA KUBANTU GALLERY




